# **SENATE BILL 401**

### A BILL ENTITLED

#### 1 AN ACT concerning

# Pharmacists - Administration of Vaccinations - Expanded Authority and Reporting Requirements

4 FOR the purpose of altering the authority of pharmacists to administer certain  $\mathbf{5}$ vaccinations to certain individuals; authorizing a pharmacist to administer 6 certain vaccinations to an individual in a certain age group who has a 7 prescription or to an adult under a written protocol that meets certain 8 requirements; altering a certain vaccination reporting requirement; requiring a 9 pharmacist to inform certain health care practitioners that a vaccination has been administered; repealing a requirement that the State Board of Pharmacy, 10 the State Board of Physicians, and the State Board of Nursing meet periodically 11 12and take certain actions relating to certain regulations; requiring the Secretary 13 of Health and Mental Hygiene, in consultation with a workgroup of stakeholders, to study the feasibility and desirability of requiring certain health 1415care providers who administer vaccinations to report the vaccinations to the 16 ImmuNet Program; requiring the study to take certain factors into account; 17requiring the Secretary to submit the findings and recommendations of the study to certain legislative committees on or before a certain date; making 1819certain conforming changes; providing for the effective dates of this Act; and 20generally relating to the authority of pharmacists to administer vaccinations 21and requiring reporting of vaccinations.

4 5	SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

8 9 10	(a) (1) A pharmacist may administer an influenza vaccination to an individual who is at least 9 years old, in accordance with regulations adopted by the Board, in consultation with the Department.

AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That: 26(a)The Secretary of Health and Mental Hygiene shall study the feasibility 27and desirability of requiring all health care providers who administer vaccinations to report the vaccinations to the ImmuNet Program. 2829(b)In carrying out the study, the Secretary shall consult with a workgroup of 30 stakeholders, including representatives of health care providers, pharmacies, health 31insurance carriers, the State Board of Physicians, the State Board of Nursing, and the

32 State Board of Pharmacy.

2	(1) the costs and benefits of comprehensive reporting; and

5 6 7 8	(d) On or before January 1, 2014, the Secretary shall submit the findings and recommendations of the study, in accordance with § $2-1246$ of the State Government Article, to the Senate Education, Health, and Environmental Affairs Committee and the House Health and Government Operations Committee.
9 10	SECTION 4. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That Section 2 of this Act shall take effect October 1, 2015.
11	SECTION 5. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, except as provided in

12 Section 4 of this Act, this Act shall take effect October 1, 2013.
