BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows: Article - Courts and Judicial Proceedings 3-1802.Except as provided in subsection (b) of this section, this subtitle applies to a mediation in which: (1) The parties:
