Agriculture – Lawn Care Pesticides – Child Care and School Facilities – Prohibition

4 FOR the purpose of prohibiting, with a certain exception, a person from applying a 5 lawn care pesticide on the grounds of certain child care facilities and schools; 6 authorizing a person to apply a lawn care pesticide on the grounds of certain 7 child care facilities and schools if the Secretary of Agriculture determines that the emergency application is necessary to eliminate an immediate threat to 8 9 human health; prohibiting certain children from accessing an area treated with 10 a lawn care pesticide for a certain time period; requiring certain child care facilities and schools to designate a certain contact person and keep a written 11 12 record of any emergency application of a lawn care pesticide for a certain time period; requiring certain child care facilities and schools to provide a certain 13 notice of the emergency application of a lawn care pesticide to each parent, 14 15 guardian, and staff member within a certain time period; requiring the 16 Department of Agriculture to adopt certain regulations; defining certain terms; 17 and generally relating to the application of lawn care pesticides on the grounds of child care facilities and schools. 18
