## A BILL ENTITLED

#### 1 AN ACT concerning

## 2 Higher Education – Tuition Waiver – Foster Care Recipients

FOR the purpose of altering the definition of "foster care recipient", for purposes of a 3 4 certain tuition waiver, to include certain individuals who are placed into  $\mathbf{5}$ guardianship or who are adopted out of an out-of-home placement by a certain 6 guardianship family; providing that certain foster care recipients are eligible for 7 a certain tuition waiver if the recipient is enrolled in a vocational certificate 8 program at a public institution of higher education in the State, subject to 9 certain conditions; and generally relating to tuition waivers at institutions of 10 higher education for foster care recipients.

Resided in an out-of-home placement in the 1  $\mathbf{2}$ State at the time the individual graduated from high school or successfully completed 3 a general equivalency development examination (GED); or 4 B. Resided in an out-of-home placement in the State on  $\mathbf{5}$ the individual's 13th birthday and was PLACED INTO GUARDIANSHIP OR adopted out of an out-of-home placement after the individual's 13th birthday. 6 "Foster care recipient" includes a younger sibling of an 7 (ii) 8 individual described in subparagraph (i) of this paragraph if the younger sibling is 9 concurrently PLACED INTO GUARDIANSHIP OR adopted out of an out-of-home placement by the same **GUARDIANSHIP** OR adoptive family. 10 11 "Out-of-home placement" has the meaning stated in § 5-501 of the (3)12Family Law Article. 13"Tuition" means the charges imposed by a public institution (4)(i) of higher education for enrollment at the institution. 1415"Tuition" includes charges for registration and all fees (ii) required as a condition of enrollment. 1617(b) Except as provided in paragraph (2) of this subsection, a A foster (1)care recipient is exempt from paying ANY tuition at a public institution of higher 1819education, REGARDLESS OF THAT FOSTER CARE RECIPIENT'S RECEIPT OF ANY 20SCHOLARSHIP OR GRANT if: 21The foster care recipient is enrolled at the institution on or (i) 22before the date that the foster care recipient reaches the age of 25 years; 23(ii) The foster care recipient is enrolled as a candidate for A 24VOCATIONAL CERTIFICATE, an associate's degree, or a bachelor's degree; and 25The foster care recipient has filed for federal and State (iii) 26financial aid by March 1 each year. 27If a foster care recipient receives a scholarship or grant for (2)28postsecondary study and is enrolled before the recipient's 25th birthday as a candidate 29for A VOCATIONAL CERTIFICATE, an associate's degree, or bachelor's degree at a public institution of higher education, THE SCHOLARSHIP OR GRANT MAY NOT BE 30 31 **APPLIED TO THE TUITION FOR** the foster care recipient may not be required to pay 32the difference between the amount of the scholarship or grant and the amount of the 33 tuition].

1 (3) A foster care recipient who is exempt from tuition under this 2 section continues to be exempt until the earlier of:

3 (i) 5 years after first enrolling as a candidate for A
4 VOCATIONAL CERTIFICATE, an associate's degree, or a bachelor's degree at a public
5 institution of higher education in the State; or

6 (ii) The date that the foster care recipient is awarded a 7 bachelor's degree.

8 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 9 October 1, 2013.
