1 AN ACT concerning

2 Somerset County – Emergency Burning Ban – Adoption and Enforcement

3 FOR the purpose of authorizing the County Commissioners of Somerset County to 4 adopt a certain emergency burning ban; prohibiting a person from starting or $\mathbf{5}$ allowing any open air burning during an emergency burning ban; exempting 6 certain supervised burning activities from a certain emergency burning ban; 7 authorizing the County Commissioners, by resolution, to set a fine for a violation of a certain emergency burning ban; authorizing the Sheriff of 8 9 Somerset County and the Sheriff's deputies to assess a certain fine against any person believed to be in violation of a certain emergency burning ban; defining 10 11 certain terms; and generally relating to the adoption and enforcement of an 12 emergency burning ban in Somerset County.

1 (A) (1) IN THIS SECTION THE FOLLOWING WORDS HAVE THE 2 MEANINGS INDICATED.

3 (2) "EMERGENCY BURNING BAN" MEANS A COMPLETE BAN ON 4 ALL OPEN AIR BURNING THAT IS DECLARED BY THE COUNTY COMMISSIONERS 5 DUE TO PROLONGED DROUGHT OR UNUSUAL CONDITIONS THAT ARE 6 CONDUCIVE TO THE EASY START AND SPREAD OF FIRE.

7 (3) "OPEN AIR BURNING" MEANS BURNING ANY MATERIAL IN THE
8 OPEN OR IN A RECEPTACLE OTHER THAN A FURNACE, INCINERATOR, OR OTHER
9 EQUIPMENT CONNECTED TO A STACK OR CHIMNEY.

10(B) THE COUNTY COMMISSIONERS MAY ADOPT AN EMERGENCY11BURNING BAN EFFECTIVE THROUGHOUT THE COUNTY.

12 (C) (1) SUBJECT TO PARAGRAPH (2) OF THIS SUBSECTION, A PERSON 13 MAY NOT START OR ALLOW OPEN AIR BURNING DURING AN EMERGENCY 14 BURNING BAN.

15 (2) THIS SUBSECTION DOES NOT APPLY TO:

16(I)OPEN AIR BURNING ON STATE-OWNED PROPERTY THAT17IS CONDUCTED IN ACCORDANCE WITH STATE LAW;

18(II)THE SUPERVISED BURNING OF BUILDINGS OR19SOLID, LIQUID, OR GASEOUS FUELS CONDUCTED UNDER THE DIRECT CONTROL20AND SUPERVISION OF QUALIFIED INSTRUCTORS AT A TRAINING CENTER21OPERATED BY A FIRE DEPARTMENT; OR

22(III)ANY OTHER SUPERVISED BURNING CONDUCTED23UNDER THE DIRECT CONTROL AND SUPERVISION OF:

241.A QUALIFIED FIRE INSTRUCTOR; OR

25 **2.** A FIRE CHIEF, CAPTAIN, OR FIRE LINE OFFICER 26 OF A FIRE DEPARTMENT THAT HAS JURISDICTION OVER THE AREA WHERE THE 27 SUPERVISED BURNING OCCURS.

28 (D) THE COUNTY COMMISSIONERS, BY RESOLUTION, MAY SET A FINE 29 FOR A VIOLATION OF AN EMERGENCY BURNING BAN ADOPTED UNDER 30 SUBSECTION (B) OF THIS SECTION.

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1 (E) THE SHERIFF AND THE SHERIFF'S DEPUTIES MAY ASSESS A FINE 2 ESTABLISHED UNDER SUBSECTION (D) OF THIS SECTION AGAINST ANY PERSON 3 BELIEVED TO BE IN VIOLATION OF AN EMERGENCY BURNING BAN ADOPTED 4 UNDER SUBSECTION (B) OF THIS SECTION.

5 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 6 October 1, 2013.
