

# SENATE BILL 458

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## A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Calvert County – Public Facilities Bonds**

3 FOR the purpose of authorizing and empowering the County Commissioners of  
4 Calvert County, from time to time, to borrow not more than \$33,810,000 to  
5 finance the construction, improvement, or development of certain public  
6 facilities in Calvert County, as herein defined, and to effect such borrowing by  
7 the issuance and sale at public or private sale of its general obligation bonds in  
8 like par amount; empowering the County to fix and determine, by resolution,  
9 the form, tenor, interest rate or rates or method of determining the same, terms,  
10 conditions, maturities, and all other details incident to the issuance and sale of  
11 the bonds; empowering the County to issue refunding bonds for the purchase or  
12 redemption of bonds in advance of maturity; empowering and directing the  
13 County to levy, impose, and collect, annually, ad valorem taxes in rate and  
14 amount sufficient to provide funds for the payment of the maturing principal of  
15 and interest on the bonds; exempting the bonds and refunding bonds and the  
16 interest thereon and any income derived therefrom from all State, county,  
17 municipal, and other taxation in the State of Maryland; providing that nothing  
18 in this Act shall prevent the County from authorizing the issuance and sale of  
19 bonds the interest on which is not excludable from gross income for federal  
20 income tax purposes; and generally relating to the issuance and sale of such  
21 bonds.

22 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF  
23 MARYLAND, That, as used herein, the term “County” means the body politic and  
24 corporate of the State of Maryland known as the County Commissioners of Calvert  
25 County, and the term “construction, improvement, or development of public facilities”  
26 means the acquisition, alteration, construction, reconstruction, enlargement,  
27 equipping, expansion, extension, improvement, rehabilitation, renovation, upgrading,  
28 and repair of public buildings and facilities, including but not limited to the  
29 Emergency Communication System Upgrade and Expansions, Appeal Waterline  
30 Extension, Pasri Oaks Pump Station Rehab, and St. Leonard Well and Storage, and

1 issuance costs together with the costs of acquiring land or interests in land as well as  
2 any related architectural, financial, legal, planning, or engineering services.

3 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the County is hereby  
4 authorized to finance any part or all of the costs of the public facilities described in  
5 Section 1 of this Act, and to borrow money and incur indebtedness for that purpose, at  
6 one time or from time to time, in an amount not exceeding, in the aggregate,  
7 \$33,810,000 and to evidence such borrowing by the issuance and sale upon its full  
8 faith and credit of general obligation bonds in like par amount, which may be issued at  
9 one time or from time to time, in one or more groups or series, as the County may  
10 determine.

11 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the bonds shall be issued  
12 in accordance with a resolution of the County, which shall describe generally the  
13 construction, improvement, or development of public facilities for which the proceeds  
14 of the bond sale are intended and the amount needed for those purposes. The County  
15 shall have and is hereby granted full and complete authority and discretion in the  
16 resolution to fix and determine with respect to the bonds of any issue: the designation,  
17 date of issue, denomination or denominations, form or forms, and tenor of the bonds  
18 which, without limitation, may be issued in registered form within the meaning of  
19 Section 30 of Article 31 of the Annotated Code of Maryland, as amended; the rate or  
20 rates of interest payable thereon, or the method of determining the same, which may  
21 include a variable rate; the date or dates and amount or amounts of maturity, which  
22 need not be in equal par amounts or in consecutive annual installments, provided only  
23 that no bond of any issue shall mature later than 30 years from the date of its issue;  
24 the manner of selling the bonds, which may be at either public or private sale, for such  
25 price or prices as may be determined to be for the best interests of Calvert County; the  
26 manner of executing and sealing the bonds, which may be by facsimile; the terms and  
27 conditions, if any, under which bonds may be tendered for payment or purchase prior  
28 to their stated maturity; the terms or conditions, if any, under which bonds may or  
29 shall be redeemed prior to their stated maturity; the place or places of payment of the  
30 principal of and the interest on the bonds, which may be at any bank or trust company  
31 within or without the State of Maryland; covenants relating to compliance with  
32 applicable requirements of federal income tax law, including (without limitation)  
33 covenants regarding the payment of rebate or penalties in lieu of rebate; covenants  
34 relating to compliance with applicable requirements of federal or state securities laws;  
35 and generally all matters incident to the terms, conditions, issuance, sale, and delivery  
36 thereof.

37 The bonds may be made redeemable before maturity, at the option of the  
38 County, at such price or prices and under such terms and conditions as may be fixed  
39 by the County prior to the issuance of the bonds, either in the resolution or in a bond  
40 order pursuant to the bond resolution. The bonds may be issued in registered form and  
41 provision may be made for the registration of the principal only. In case any officer  
42 whose signature appears on any bond ceases to be such officer before the delivery  
43 thereof, such signature shall nevertheless be valid and sufficient for all purposes as if  
44 he had remained in office until such delivery. The bonds and the issuance and sale

1 thereof shall be exempt from the provisions of Sections 9, 10, and 11 of Article 31 of  
2 the Annotated Code of Maryland, as amended.

3 The County may enter into agreements with agents, banks, fiduciaries,  
4 insurers, or others for the purpose of enhancing the marketability of any security for  
5 the bonds and for the purpose of securing any tender option that may be granted to  
6 holders of the bonds, all as may be determined and presented in the aforesaid  
7 resolution, which may (but need not) state as security for the performance by the  
8 County of any monetary obligations under such agreements the same security given by  
9 the County to bondholders for the performance by the County of its monetary  
10 obligations under the bonds.

11 If the County determines in the resolution to offer any of the bonds by  
12 solicitation of competitive bids at public sale, the resolution shall fix the terms and  
13 conditions of the public sale and shall adopt a form of notice of sale, which shall  
14 outline the terms and conditions, and a form of advertisement, which shall be  
15 published in one or more daily or weekly newspapers having a general circulation in  
16 the County and which may also be published in one or more journals having a  
17 circulation primarily among banks and investment bankers. At least one publication of  
18 the advertisement shall be made not less than 10 days before the sale of the bonds.

19 Upon delivery of any bonds to the purchaser or purchasers, payment therefor  
20 shall be made to the Treasurer of Calvert County or such other official of Calvert  
21 County as may be designated to receive such payment in a resolution passed by the  
22 County before such delivery.

23 SECTION 4. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the net proceeds of the  
24 sale of bonds shall be used and applied exclusively and solely for the acquisition,  
25 construction, improvement, or development of public facilities for which the bonds are  
26 sold. If the amounts borrowed shall prove inadequate to finance the projects described  
27 in the resolution, the County may issue additional bonds with the limitations hereof  
28 for the purpose of evidencing the borrowing of additional funds for such financing,  
29 provided the resolution authorizing the sale of additional bonds shall so recite, but if  
30 the net proceeds of the sale of any issue of bonds exceed the amount needed to finance  
31 the projects described in the resolution, the excess funds so borrowed and not  
32 expended shall be applied to the payment of the next principal maturity of the bonds  
33 or to the redemption of any part of the bonds which have been made redeemable or to  
34 the purchase and cancellation of bonds, unless the County shall adopt a resolution  
35 allocating the excess funds to the acquisition, construction, improvement, or  
36 development of other public facilities, as defined and within the limits set forth in this  
37 Act.

38 SECTION 5. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the bonds hereby  
39 authorized shall constitute, and they shall so recite, an irrevocable pledge of the full  
40 faith and credit and unlimited taxing power of the County to the payment of the  
41 maturing principal of and interest on the bonds as and when they become payable. In  
42 each and every fiscal year that any of the bonds are outstanding, the County shall levy

1 or cause to be levied ad valorem taxes upon all the assessable property within the  
2 corporate limits of the County in rate and amount sufficient to provide for or assure  
3 the payment, when due, of the principal of and interest on all the bonds maturing in  
4 each such fiscal year and, in the event the proceeds from the taxes so levied in any  
5 such fiscal year shall prove inadequate for such payment, additional taxes shall be  
6 levied in the succeeding fiscal year to make up any such deficiency. The County may  
7 apply to the payment of the principal of and interest on any bonds issued hereunder  
8 any funds received by it from the State of Maryland, the United States of America, any  
9 agency or instrumentality thereof, or from any other source, if such funds are granted  
10 for the purpose of assisting the County in financing the acquisition, construction,  
11 improvement, or development of the public facilities defined in this Act and, to the  
12 extent of any such funds received or receivable in any fiscal year, the taxes that are  
13 required to be levied may be reduced accordingly.

14 SECTION 6. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the County is further  
15 authorized and empowered, at any time and from time to time, to issue its bonds in  
16 the manner hereinabove described for the purpose of refunding, by payment at  
17 maturity or upon purchase or redemption, any bonds issued hereunder. The validity of  
18 any such refunding bonds shall in no way be dependent upon or related to the validity  
19 or invalidity of the obligations so refunded. The powers herein granted with respect to  
20 the issuance of bonds shall be applicable to the issuance of refunding bonds. Such  
21 refunding bonds may be issued by the County in such an amount as shall be necessary  
22 for the purpose of providing it with funds to pay any of its outstanding bonds issued  
23 hereunder at maturity, for the purpose of providing it with funds to purchase in the  
24 open market any of its outstanding bonds issued hereunder, prior to the maturity  
25 thereof, or for the purpose of providing it with funds for the redemption prior to  
26 maturity of any outstanding bonds issued hereunder which are, by their terms,  
27 redeemable, for the purpose of providing it with funds to pay interest on any  
28 outstanding bonds issued hereunder prior to their payment at maturity of purchase or  
29 redemption in advance of maturity, or for the purpose of providing it with funds to pay  
30 any redemption or purchase premium in connection with the refunding of any of its  
31 outstanding bonds issued hereunder. The proceeds of the sale of any such refunding  
32 bonds shall be segregated and set apart by the County as a separate trust fund to be  
33 used solely for the purpose of paying the purchase or redemption prices of the bonds to  
34 be refunded.

35 SECTION 7. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the County may, prior to  
36 the preparation of definitive bonds, issue interim certificates or temporary bonds,  
37 exchangeable for definitive bonds when such bonds have been executed and are  
38 available for such delivery, provided, however, that any such interim certificates or  
39 temporary bonds shall be issued in all respects subject to the restrictions and  
40 requirements set forth in this Act. The County may, by appropriate resolution, provide  
41 for the replacement of any bonds issued hereunder which shall have become mutilated  
42 or lost or destroyed upon such conditions and after receiving such indemnity as the  
43 County may require.

1           SECTION 8. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That any and all obligations  
2 issued pursuant to the authority of this Act, their transfer, the interest payable  
3 thereon, and any income derived therefrom in the hands of the holders thereof from  
4 time to time (including any profit made in the sale thereof) shall be and are hereby  
5 declared to be at all times exempt from State, county, municipal, or other taxation of  
6 every kind and nature whatsoever within the State of Maryland. Nothing in this Act  
7 shall prevent the County from authorizing the issuance and sale of bonds the interest  
8 on which is not excludable from gross income for federal income tax purposes.

9           SECTION 9. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the authority to borrow  
10 money and issue bonds conferred on the County by this Act shall be deemed to provide  
11 an additional and alternative authority for borrowing money and shall be regarded as  
12 supplemental and additional to powers conferred upon the County by other laws and  
13 shall not be regarded as in derogation of any power now existing; and all Acts of the  
14 General Assembly of Maryland heretofore passed authorizing the County to borrow  
15 money are hereby continued to the extent that the powers contained in such Acts have  
16 not been exercised, and nothing contained in this Act may be construed to impair, in  
17 any way, the validity of any bonds that may have been issued by the County under the  
18 authority of any said Acts, and the validity of the bonds is hereby ratified, confirmed,  
19 and approved. This Act, being necessary for the welfare of the inhabitants of Calvert  
20 County, shall be liberally construed to effect the purposes hereof. All Acts and parts of  
21 Acts inconsistent with the provisions of this Act are hereby repealed to the extent of  
22 such inconsistency.

23           SECTION 10. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take  
24 effect June 1, 2013.
