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Primary and Secondary Education – Online Courses and Services – Accessibility

4 FOR the purpose of requiring the development, review, and approval of certain online $\mathbf{5}$ courses and services to include an assessment regarding the accessibility of the 6 online course or service to certain individuals with disabilities; authorizing the 7 State Department of Education or a county board of education to contract with a 8 third party for the development of a certain assessment or a certain method by 9 which certain online courses or services will be made available to certain 10 individuals; authorizing the State Board of Education to set certain fees for the development of a certain assessment and a certain method; and generally 11 12 relating to the accessibility of online courses and services to individuals with 13disabilities, including the blind.
