Washington County – Amusement Devices – Tip Jars

FOR the purpose of altering the definition of "amusement device" as it relates to the 3 4 operation and regulation of amusement devices in Washington County to $\mathbf{5}$ include a game activated by an object or another consideration of value; altering 6 the definition of "gross profits" as it relates to the operation of tip jars in 7 Washington County to require the deduction of the cost of a gaming sticker; 8 repealing a certain limit on the maximum amount a tip jar licensee may retain 9 from gross profits; and generally relating to the operation and regulation of amusement devices and tip jars in Washington County. 10
