1 AN ACT concerning

2 Natural Resources – Nuisance Organisms – Penalties

FOR the purpose of creating a separate criminal offense for each nuisance organism
imported or possessed in violation of certain provisions of law or regulation;
establishing a certain total maximum fine for offenses arising out of the same
enforcement action; authorizing a judge to award a certain monetary reward to
a person who provides information leading to a certain conviction, under certain
circumstances; and generally relating to nuisance organisms.

6 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 7 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

10 (a) (8) "Nuisance organism" means a nonnative aquatic organism that 11 will foreseeably alter and threaten to harm the ecosystem or the abundance and 12 diversity of native or naturalized fish and other organisms.

(i) (1) In addition to any other penalty provided under law, a person who
violates a provision of this section OR A REGULATION ADOPTED UNDER THIS
SECTION is guilty of a misdemeanor and on conviction is subject to imprisonment not
exceeding 30 days or a fine not exceeding \$2,500 or both FOR EACH OFFENSE, BUT
NOT EXCEEDING A TOTAL OF \$25,000 FOR OFFENSES ARISING OUT OF THE SAME
ENFORCEMENT ACTION.

19 (2) EACH NUISANCE ORGANISM IMPORTED OR POSSESSED IN
20 VIOLATION OF THIS SECTION OR A REGULATION ADOPTED UNDER THIS SECTION
21 CONSTITUTES A SEPARATE OFFENSE.

(1) SUBJECT TO SUBPARAGRAPHS (II) AND (III) OF THIS
PARAGRAPH, ON ENTERING A CONVICTION FOR A VIOLATION UNDER THIS
SECTION, A JUDGE MAY AWARD A PORTION OF ANY FINES COLLECTED UNDER
THIS SECTION TO A PERSON WHO PROVIDED INFORMATION LEADING TO THE
CONVICTION.

27 (II) AN AWARD THAT IS GRANTED UNDER THIS PARAGRAPH
28 MAY NOT EXCEED ONE-HALF OF THE TOTAL FINES COLLECTED UNDER THIS
29 SECTION.

30(III)An award under this paragraph may not be made31TO A LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICER OR TO AN EMPLOYEE OF THE DEPARTMENT.

32 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 33 June 1, 2013.
