CHAPTER _____

1 AN ACT concerning

Task Force to Study the Implementation of a Hub and Spoke Program in the Southern Maryland Region

4 FOR the purpose of establishing the Task Force to Study the Implementation of a Hub $\mathbf{5}$ and Spoke Program in the Southern Maryland Region; providing for the 6 composition, chair, and staffing of the Task Force; prohibiting a member of the 7Task Force from receiving certain compensation; requiring the Task Force to 8 study and make recommendations regarding certain matters; requiring the 9 Task Force to report its findings and recommendations to the Secretary of 10 Agriculture and the General Assembly on or before a certain date; providing for 11 the termination of this Act; and generally relating to the Task Force to Study 12the Implementation of a Hub and Spoke Program in the Southern Maryland 13 Region.

14 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 15 MARYLAND, That:

16 (a) There is a Task Force to Study the Implementation of a Hub and Spoke 17 Program in the Southern Maryland Region, including Charles County, Calvert 18 County, and St. Mary's County, to provide the low-income, working poor, and 19 unemployed populations of that region with fresh farm products.

20 (b) The Task Force consists of the following members:

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
June 1, 2013. It shall remain effective for a period of 1 year and 1 month and, at the
end of June 30, 2014, with no further action required by the General Assembly, this
Act shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.
