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## Higher Education – Charles W. Riley Firefighter and Ambulance and Rescue Squad Member Scholarship

FOR the purpose of establishing the Charles W. Riley Firefighter and Ambulance and Member Scholarship: establishing Rescue Squad certain eligibility requirements for the scholarship; authorizing the use of the scholarship for certain educational expenses; authorizing the annual amount of the scholarship awarded to be up to a certain percentage of the equivalent tuition and certain fees of a certain institution of higher education; requiring the scholarship recipient to maintain a certain grade point average; providing for the duration of the scholarship; requiring scholarship applicants and recipients to file for certain federal and State financial aid by a certain date; authorizing legislative scholarship funds to be used for certain purposes; providing that funds for the scholarship are as provided in a certain annual budget by the Governor; establishing a certain fund; requiring the Maryland Higher Education Commission to administer a certain fund; providing that the fund is a certain special, nonlapsing fund that is not subject to a certain section of the State Finance and Procurement Article; requiring the State Treasurer to hold the fund separately and requiring the Comptroller to account for the fund; directing the Commission to use certain gifts and grants for the fund in a certain manner; requiring the Commission to prepare a certain annual report regarding the fund; requiring a recipient of a certain scholarship to work for at least a certain number of years as a certain firefighter or certain rescue squad member in the State after completion of a certain program; requiring a certain amount of money to be distributed for the scholarship; repealing the distribution of a

- 12 (iv) After the distribution under subparagraphs (ii) and (iii) of 13 this paragraph and until a total of \$20,000,000 has been distributed to the Volunteer 14 Company Assistance Fund since the establishment of the surcharge under this 15 subsection, the remainder shall be credited to the Volunteer Company Assistance 16 Fund to be used in accordance with the provisions of Title 8, Subtitle 2 of the Public 17 Safety Article.
- 18 (v) After a total of \$20,000,000 has been distributed to the Volunteer Company Assistance Fund, 100% of the remainder shall be credited to the Maryland Emergency Medical Systems Operation Fund established under § 13–955 of the Transportation Article.

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- 30 (a) There is a Charles W. Riley Fire and Emergency Medical Services Tuition 31 Reimbursement Program under this section.
  - (b) As provided in the State budget, any career or volunteer firefighter or ambulance or rescue squad member who is a resident of Maryland shall receive partial or full and complete reimbursement by the Office for tuition costs not to exceed the resident tuition rates at the 4-year public institution of higher education within the University System of Maryland, other than the University of Maryland University

- College and University of Maryland, Baltimore, with the highest annual expenses for a full-time resident undergraduate, for courses credited toward a degree in fire service technology or emergency medical technology.
- 4 (c) (1) The tuition reimbursement application shall be filed with the 5 Office no later than July 1 immediately following the academic year for which tuition 6 reimbursement is sought.
- 7 (2) Payment shall be made 1 year after successful completion of each 8 academic year.
- 9 (3) Payment may be made only if the applicant is still employed or 10 actively engaged as a career or volunteer firefighter or ambulance or rescue squad 11 member in an organized fire department or ambulance or rescue squad in this State.]
- SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the Maryland Higher Education Commission may not accept new applications for the Charles W. Riley Fire and Emergency Medical Services Tuition Reimbursement Program after July 1, 2014.
- SECTION 4. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That on October 2, 2015, any funds remaining in the Charles W. Riley Fire and Emergency Medical Services Tuition Reimbursement Program shall be transferred to the Charles W. Riley Firefighter and Ambulance and Rescue Squad Member Scholarship Fund as enacted by Section 1 of this Act.
- 20 SECTION 5. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the Office of Student 21Financial Assistance in the Maryland Higher Education Commission shall provide the 22public with notice of the establishment of the Charles W. Riley Firefighter and 23 Ambulance and Rescue Squad Member Scholarship as a replacement for the Charles 24W. Riley Fire and Emergency Medical Services Tuition Reimbursement Program, 25 including posting information on the Office of Student Financial Assistance of the 26 Maryland Higher Education Commission Web site and conducting outreach activities 27 to fire departments and ambulance and rescue squads in the State.
- SECTION 6. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That Section 2 of this Act shall take effect October 1, 2015.
- SECTION 7. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, except as provided in Section 6 of this Act, this Act shall take effect July 1, 2013.
