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Health – Overdose Response Program – Establishment

3 FOR the purpose of providing for an Overdose Response Program overseen by the Department of Health and Mental Hygiene; stating the purpose of the Program; 4 $\mathbf{5}$ authorizing requiring the Department to adopt certain regulations and 6 authorizing the Department to take certain other action regarding the Program: 7 specifying the requirements an individual must meet to qualify for a certain 8 certificate; requiring that a certain educational training program be conducted 9 by a physician or nurse practitioner or certain other individuals and include 10 certain training; requiring an applicant for a certificate to submit a certain 11 application; requiring a certain public or private entity to issue a certificate to 12an applicant under certain circumstances; requiring that a certificate contain 13 certain information; providing that a replacement certificate may be issued
