Health – Overdose Response Program – Establishment

3 FOR the purpose of providing for an Overdose Response Program overseen by the 4 Department of Health and Mental Hygiene; stating the purpose of the Program; $\mathbf{5}$ authorizing the Department to adopt certain regulations and take certain other 6 action regarding the Program; specifying the requirements an individual must 7 meet to qualify for a certain certificate; requiring that a certain educational 8 training program be conducted by a physician or nurse practitioner or certain other individuals and include certain training; requiring an applicant for a 9 certificate to submit a certain application; requiring a certain public or private 10entity to issue a certificate to an applicant under certain circumstances; 11 12requiring that a certificate contain certain information; providing that a 13 replacement certificate may be issued under certain circumstances; providing 14for the term and renewal of a certain certificate; authorizing an individual who 15is certified to receive from a certain individual a prescription for naloxone and 16 certain supplies, possess prescribed naloxone and certain paraphernalia, and administer naloxone, under certain circumstances, to certain individuals; 17authorizing a physician or nurse practitioner to prescribe and dispense naloxone 1819to a certificate holder; prohibiting a certain cause of action from arising against 20a certificate holder. physician, or nurse practitioner under certain circumstances; prohibiting a certificate holder, physician, 21and nurse 22practitioner from being held civilly or criminally liable for certain actions; 23providing that a certificate holder, under certain circumstances, may not be 24considered to be practicing medicine for the purposes of a certain provision of 25law; providing that a certain provision of this Act does not affect certain 26immunities or defenses; prohibiting an individual from being held civilly liable 27in certain actions under certain circumstances; providing for the construction of 28this Act; defining certain terms; and generally relating to the Overdose 29Response Program.

NOT BE HELD CIVILLY OR CRIMINALLY LIABLE FOR ACTIONS AUTHORIZED BY
THIS SUBTITLE.
