| 4 5 6 7 8 9 10 11 12 13 | FOR the purpose of establishing the Task Force on Democracy and Representative Government in Maryland for the 21st Century; requiring the Task Force to study and evaluate the General Assembly's structure, organization, and process; requiring the Task Force to make recommendations on changes to the State's legislative structure, organization, and process that would achieve certain goals; providing for the membership of the Task Force; providing staff for the Task Force; requiring the Task Force to report its findings and recommendations to the Governor and the General Assembly by a certain date; providing for the termination of the Task Force; and generally relating to the Task Force on Democracy and Representative Government in Maryland for the 21st Century. |
| 14 15 | SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That: |
| 16 17 | (a) There is a Task Force on Democracy and Representative Government in Maryland for the 21st Century. |
| 18 | (b) The Task Force consists of the following 15 members: |
| 19 20 | (1) five members of the Senate of Maryland, appointed by the President of the Senate; and |
| 21 22 | (2) five members of the House of Delegates, appointed by the Speaker of the House of Delegates; and |

(3) five members of the public, appointed by the Governor;



- 1 (c) The President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Delegates 2 jointly shall call the first meeting of the Task Force.
- 3 (d) The Task Force shall elect its chair who shall call all future meetings of 4 the Task Force.
- 5 (e) The Department of Legislative Services, the School of Public Policy of the 6 University of Maryland, Baltimore County, and the School of Public Policy of the 7 University of Maryland, College Park, shall provide staff for the Task Force.
- 8 (f) A member of the Task Force:
- 9 (1) may not receive compensation; but
- 10 (2) is entitled to reimbursement for expenses under the Standard 11 State Travel Regulations, as provided in the State budget.
- 12 (g) The Task Force shall study and evaluate the General Assembly's structure, organization, and process and make recommendations for:
- 14 (1) changes to the redistricting process that provide for more efficient 15 and less political drawing of boundaries for State legislative districts and 16 congressional districts;
- 17 (2) changes to the legislative structure and process that enhance the 18 ability of the General Assembly to address the State's problems promptly and 19 decisively; and
- 20 (3) changes that would improve the public's perception of the General Assembly as an important and accountable equal branch of State government with the Executive Branch.
- 23 (h) The Task Force shall submit a report of its findings and 24 recommendations to the Governor and, in accordance with § 2–1246 of the State 25 Government Article, the General Assembly on or before December 1, 2014.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 2013. It shall remain effective for a period of 1 year and 3 months and, at the end of December 31, 2014, with no further action required by the General Assembly, this Act shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.
