# A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

# 2 State Retirement and Pension System – Board of Trustees

- FOR the purpose of adding a trustee to the Board of Trustees for the State Retirement and Pension System to represent certain interests; establishing the qualifications of the trustee; providing for the appointment of the trustee; and generally relating to the Board of Trustees for the State Retirement and Pension System.

### 13 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 14 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

- 15 Article State Personnel and Pensions
- 16 21–104.
- 17 (a) The Board of Trustees consists of the following [14] **15** trustees:
- 18 (1) the Secretary of Budget and Management, ex officio;
- 19 (2) the State Comptroller, ex officio;
- 20 (3) the State Treasurer, ex officio, who may appoint a deputy treasurer 21 as designee; and

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(4) [11] **12** trustees elected or appointed as follows:

(i) one trustee who is a member of the Correctional Officers'
Retirement System, the Employees' Pension System, the Employees' Retirement
System, the Judges' Retirement System, the Legislative Pension Plan, the Local Fire
and Police System, or the Law Enforcement Officers' Pension Plan, who shall be
elected as provided in subsection (b) of this section and may not be an employee of the
State Retirement Agency;

8 (ii) one trustee who is a retiree of the Correctional Officers' 9 Retirement System, the Employees' Pension System, the Employees' Retirement 10 System, the Judges' Retirement System, the Legislative Pension Plan, the Local Fire 11 and Police System, or the Law Enforcement Officers' Pension Plan, who shall be 12 elected as provided in subsection (b) of this section and may not be an employee of the 13 State Retirement Agency;

14 (iii) one trustee who is a member of the Teachers' Pension 15 System or the Teachers' Retirement System, who shall be elected as provided in 16 subsection (b) of this section and may not be an employee of the State Retirement 17 Agency;

(iv) one trustee who is a retiree of the Teachers' Pension System
or the Teachers' Retirement System, who shall be elected as provided in subsection (b)
of this section and may not be an employee of the State Retirement Agency;

(v) one trustee who is either a member or retiree of the State
Police Retirement System, who shall be elected as provided in subsection (b) of this
section and may not be an employee of the State Retirement Agency;

(vi) one trustee who represents the interests of participating
governmental units in the Employees' Pension System and the Employees' Retirement
System; [and]

(VII) ONE TRUSTEE WHO REPRESENTS THE INTERESTS OF
 COUNTY GOVERNMENTS WHO HAS AT LEAST 10 YEARS OF EXPERIENCE IN
 FINANCIAL MANAGEMENT AND OVERSIGHT OF COUNTY GOVERNMENT BUDGETS;
 AND

- 31 [(vii)] (VIII) five trustees who:
- 32 1. represent the interests of the public;
- 33 2. are not members of any of the several systems;

34 3. are not employees, directors, partners, or officers of 35 any of the external investment managers for the several systems; 1 4. do not have an ownership interest in any of the 2 external investment managers of the several systems that is greater than 5% of the 3 issued or outstanding stock;

5. are not directors, partners, or officers of any corporation or large organization in which any of the external managers for the several systems own 10% or more of the issued or outstanding stock of the corporation or large organization; and

8 6. have at least 10 years of substantial experience 9 overseeing similar pension systems, large foundations, or other similar large 10 organizations with fiduciary responsibilities relating to different classes of 11 participants.

12 (b) (1) (i) The trustees who are members or retirees of the 13 Correctional Officers' Retirement System, the Employees' Pension System, the 14 Employees' Retirement System, the Judges' Retirement System, the Legislative 15 Pension Plan, the Local Fire and Police System, or the Law Enforcement Officers' 16 Pension Plan shall be elected by the members and the retirees of those State systems.

(ii) The trustees who are members or retirees of the Teachers'
Pension System or the Teachers' Retirement System shall be elected by the members
and the retirees of those State systems.

20 (iii) The trustee who is a member or retiree of the State Police
21 Retirement System shall be elected by the members and the retirees of that State
22 system.

23 (iv) The elections shall be conducted under regulations that the24 Board of Trustees adopts.

(2) The trustee who represents the interests of participating
subdivisions in the Employees' Pension System and the Employees' Retirement
System shall be appointed by the Governor.

(3) The trustees who represent the public shall be appointed by theGovernor with the advice and consent of the Senate.

30(4) THE TRUSTEE WHO REPRESENTS THE INTERESTS OF COUNTY31GOVERNMENTS SHALL BE APPOINTED BY THE GOVERNOR AND MAY BE FROM A32LIST SUBMITTED TO THE GOVERNOR BY THE MARYLAND ASSOCIATION OF33COUNTIES.

34 (c) (1) Within 10 days after the appointment or election of an individual 35 as a trustee, the individual shall take and subscribe to an oath of office that, so far as 36 it devolves on the individual, as trustee the individual:

will diligently and honestly administer the affairs of the 1 (i)  $\mathbf{2}$ Board of Trustees: and 3 (ii) will not knowingly violate or willingly allow a violation of 4 the law applicable to the several systems. The officer before whom the individual takes the oath shall:  $\mathbf{5}$ (2)6 certify the oath; and (i) 7 (ii) submit the oath immediately to the office of the Secretary of 8 State for filing in that office. (d) 9 (1)(i) The term of an appointed or elected trustee is 4 years. 10 (ii) Trustees who represent the public serve staggered 4-year 11 terms. 12(2)A trustee who is a member but not a retiree of the Correctional Officers' Retirement System, the Employees' Pension System, the Employees' 13Retirement System, the Judges' Retirement System, the Legislative Pension Plan, the 14Local Fire and Police System, the Law Enforcement Officers' Pension Plan, the 1516 Teachers' Pension System, or the Teachers' Retirement System at the time of election of the trustee may complete the term of office even if, during the term, the trustee: 1718 becomes a retiree of the State system of which the trustee (i) was a member at the time of election; and 19 20has completed more than 3 years of the trustee's term of (ii) 21office. 22(3)A vacancy in the office of a trustee shall be filled for the unexpired 23term in the same manner as the office was previously filled. 24(4) At the end of a term, a trustee continues to serve until a successor 25is appointed or elected. 26(5)A trustee who is appointed after a term has begun serves only for 27the rest of the term and until a successor is selected and gualifies. 28(e) Except as provided in paragraph (2) of this subsection, each trustee (1)29shall attend at least 80% of the monthly Board of Trustees meetings held during a 30 1-year period beginning January 1. 31(2)A trustee may be granted an excused absence by the (i) chairman of the Board or another officer of the Board due to: 32
