necessary to make the Registry operational by a certain date; and generally

20 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 21 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

2 (a) (1) The Secretary [may] SHALL, by regulation, set a fee for any 3 service of the Registry, including an initial fee to utilize the services of the Registry 4 and renewal fees.

- 5 (2) The fees set by the Secretary may not, in the aggregate, exceed the 6 Department's costs to establish and operate the Registry.
- 7 (b) (1) The Department may, by contract, obtain from any person services 8 related to the establishment and operation of the Registry.
- 9 (2) Notwithstanding any contract in accordance with paragraph (1) of 10 this subsection, the Department is responsible for the Registry.
- 11 (c) The Department shall carry out appropriate educational and outreach 12 efforts to increase public awareness of the Registry.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the Department of
Health and Mental Hygiene shall take all the steps necessary to make the Advance
Directive Registry established under Title 5, Subtitle 6, Part II of the Health –
General Article operational on or before October 1, 2014.

SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effectOctober 1, 2013.

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
