A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

Oyster Dredging - Waters North of the Chesapeake Bay Bridge and Kent Narrows Bridge

FOR the purpose of adding the waters of Anne Arundel County, Baltimore County, Cecil County, Harford County, Kent County, and Queen Anne's County that lie north of the Chesapeake Bay Bridge and the Kent Narrows Bridge to the areas of State waters in the Chesapeake Bay where a person may catch oysters by dredge; and generally relating to oyster dredging in the Chesapeake Bay.

14 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 15 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

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Article – Natural Resources

17 4–1012.

18 A person may not catch oysters by dredge in the Atlantic Coastal Bays, as (a) 19defined in § 8–1802 of this article, or in the following areas of the Chesapeake Bay: the 20area bounded by a line drawn from Lowes Point towards the Bloody Point Lighthouse 21for a distance of 1.8 miles, and then direct to North Point on Poplar Island; then 22southerly around the westerly shore of Poplar Island to the southwesterly most point; 23then running in a straight line to the Department marker on the northern shore of 24Pawpaw Cove which area shall be reserved for catching of oysters with shaft tongs only; all the area lying within one-fourth mile of the western shore of Poplar Island; 2526all the area within one-half mile of Plum Point; all the area within one and one-half

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miles of Sandy Point, Hackett Point, Tolly Point, and Thomas Point within Anne 1 $\mathbf{2}$ Arundel County waters; and the following ovster bars: 2–9, 2–10, 5–1, 5–2, 5–3A, 3 5–3B, 8–2, 8–6, and 8–9, as defined by the charts of the Oyster Survey of 1906 to 1912, 4 and its amendments.

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(b) A person may not catch ovsters by dredge except in the following waters:

ANNE ARUNDEL, BALTIMORE, CECIL, HARFORD, KENT, AND 6 (1) QUEEN ANNE'S COUNTIES. ALL THE WATERS NORTH OF THE CHESAPEAKE BAY 7BRIDGE AND THE KENT NARROWS BRIDGE. 8

9 Dorchester County. The area bounded as follows: beginning (1) **(2)** 10 at Crab Point in Honga River, then proceeding in a straight line to the most easterly point on Lower Hooper Island to the Dorchester County line, then following the shore 11 12line to Richland Point, then in a straight line southerly to Oakanhanikan Point, then 13following the north shoreline of Bloodsworth Island to Tigs Point, then in a 14northeasterly direction to Bishop Head Point, then along the shore to Crab Point, and 15then to the place of beginning.

16Dorchester and Talbot counties. All that portion of the **[**(2)**] (3)** 17Choptank River within an area bounded as follows: beginning at the Department marker on Upper Bar Neck, Tilghman Island; then proceeding in a straight line 18easterly to Benoni Lighthouse; then in a straight line easterly to Chlora Point; then in 19 20along the shore easterly to Howell Point; then southerly across the Choptank River to 21Horn Point; then westerly in a straight line to Castlehaven Point; then westerly in a 22straight line to Todd Point; then westerly in a straight line to Cook Point; along the 23shore to Hill's Point; then in a straight line to James' Point on James' Island; then in a 24straight line to Sharp's Island Lighthouse; then in a straight line to Blackwalnut 25Point; then along the shore to the Department marker, the point of the beginning.

26Somerset County. All the waters of Somerset County, except **[**(3)**] (4)** 27Pocomoke Sound, including the Wicomico, Manokin, and Big Annemessex rivers, which are defined as follows: 28

- 29Wicomico River: easterly of a straight line drawn from the former dwelling of 30 Thomas Tigner near Hains Point to the most southwesterly point of Clay Island.
- 31Manokin River: landward or upstream of a straight line joining South Point on 32Little Deals Island to Hazard Point on the mainland.

33 Big Annemessex River: easterly of a straight line from Tenth Point to Porpoise 34Point; and for the purpose of this section, Tenth Point shall be considered to be the 35 easterly point of the marsh at the entrance of Thru Creek shown on published Chart 36 No. 7 of the Oyster Survey of 1906 to 1912, at a position of latitude 38 degrees, 2 37 minutes, 19.20 seconds and longitude 75 degrees 51 minutes 39.47 seconds; and 38 Porpoise Point shall be considered to be the most westerly point of the marsh of Pat

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Island and that part of Tangier Sound, south of a line drawn in an easterly course
 from Terrapin Sands Point on the west side of Tangier Sound to the channel and then
 following the channel in a southerly direction to the Virginia Line.

4 Talbot County. The waters bayward of a line beginning at **[**(4)**] (5)** $\mathbf{5}$ Kent Point and following the territorial county line in an easterly direction to where it 6 intercepts the Queen Anne's County-Talbot County line; then following the county 7 line northeasterly to the point where a straight line drawn from Long Point to the 8 Wades Point bell buoy intersects the county line; from there in a southeasterly 9 direction to the Wades Point bell buoy; and then direct to Wades Point bell buoy; and 10 then direct to Wades Point; then following the shoreline to Lowes Point; and then 11 direct towards the Bloody Point Lighthouse for a distance of 1.8 miles; and then direct 12to North Point on Poplar Island.

13Any boat sailing over any areas of the State which are exempt from (c) dredging, by this subtitle or by rule or regulation of the Department, with any dredge, 14scrape, scoop, or similar instrument on board or in tow, may be apprehended by any 1516Natural Resources police officer or any other law enforcement officer. If the boat has 17on board any wet oysters, dredge, or dredge line, or if the deck is wet and the boat is 18 equipped for catching ovsters with dredge or similar instrument, these facts shall be 19prima facie evidence that the boat has been used to violate the provisions of this 20section.

21 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 22 October 1, 2013.
