State Retirement and Pension System - Service Credit for Unused Sick Leave

- 3 FOR the purpose of making certain members of the State Retirement and Pension 4 System eligible to receive creditable service at retirement for unused sick leave 5 accumulated as a member of a former system in the State Retirement and 6 Pension System under certain circumstances; providing for the computation of 7 the creditable service for unused sick leave accumulated in the former State 8 system; requiring the Department of Legislative Services to provide a certain 9 report on or before a certain date; and generally relating to additional creditable service at retirement for unused sick leave for members of the State Retirement 10 and Pension System. 11

- 17 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
- 18 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

19 Article – State Personnel and Pensions

- 21 (a) In this section, "unused sick leave" means sick leave credit that has not 22 been used before retirement.
- 23 (b) This section does not apply to:
- 24 (1) the Judges' Retirement System; or

2 3 4 5 6	(c) [A] EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN SUBSECTION (F) OF THIS SECTION, A member is entitled to receive creditable service for unused sick leave if the member retires on or before 30 days after the member is separated from employment with a participating employer or a participating governmental unit that has withdrawn from one of the several systems under Title 31 of this article.
7 8	(d) (1) At retirement, a member is entitled to receive creditable service for unused sick leave, on verification of the unused sick leave to the Board of Trustees.
9 10	(2) (i) This subsection does not apply to the Local Fire and Police System or the Law Enforcement Officers' Pension System.
11 12 13 14 15	(ii) A member who separates from employment for reasons other than retirement on or before June 30, 1990, is entitled to receive creditable service for unused sick leave that is reported by the member's employer at the member's separation from employment if the member was entitled to a vested allowance at the time of separation.
16 17	(e) (1) Subject to paragraph (3) of this subsection, for 22 days of unused sick leave a member is entitled to receive 1 month of creditable service.
18 19 20	(2) If fractional days totaling 11 or more result from the application of the formula described in paragraph (1) of this subsection, a member is entitled to receive 1 additional month of creditable service.
21	(3) For the purposes of this section:
22 23	(i) a member may not accumulate more than 15 days of sick leave per year;
24 25 26	(ii) unless sick leave credit is accepted and credited by the current participating employer, a member may not receive credit for unused sick leave granted by a former employer; and
27 28 29 30	(iii) if a participating employer provides a member with more than 15 days of sick leave per year, before crediting the member with additional sick leave for a year, the Board of Trustees shall reduce the member's accumulated sick leave by the lesser of:
31 32	1. the days of sick leave used by the member in that year; or
33 34	2. the number of days of sick leave provided by the participating employer for the year, less 15.

20 21	(II) THE CREDITABLE SERVICE SHALL BE COMPUTED AS PROVIDED IN SUBSECTION (E) OF THIS SECTION.
22	[(f)] (G) Credit for unused sick leave may not be used under this section:
23 24	(1) to determine years of eligibility service required for a benefit under this Division Π ; or
25	(2) to compute average final compensation.
26 27 28 29	[(g)] (H) A State employee who came into the State system while retaining sick leave and annual leave benefits under a county system and who came under the provisions of Chapter 423 of the Acts of 1971 shall be entitled to the same full credit toward retirement as provided by this section.

1	SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, on or before December 1,
2	2013, the Department of Legislative Services shall report to the Joint Committee on
3	Pensions on the cost of authorizing a member of the Correctional Officers' Retirement
4	System to remain a member of the Correctional Officers' Retirement System even
5	though the member is promoted to a position in which the member must join the
6	Employees' Pension System as a condition of employment.

SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 2013.
