CHAPTER

1 AN ACT concerning

- 3 FOR the purpose of making certain members of the State Retirement and Pension 4 System eligible to receive creditable service at retirement for the total amount 5 of unused sick leave accumulated as a member of a former system accrued by 6 the member in certain systems in the State Retirement and Pension System 7 under certain circumstances; providing for the ecomputation calculation of the creditable service for unused sick leave accumulated in the former State system 8 9 accrued by a member in certain systems; requiring the Department of Legislative Services to provide a certain report on or before a certain date; and 10 11 generally relating to additional creditable service at retirement for unused sick 12 leave for members of the State Retirement and Pension System.

28	SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, on or before December 1,		
29	2013, the Department of Legislative Services shall report to the Joint Committee or		
30	Pensions on the cost of authorizing a member of the Correctional Officers' Retirement		
31	System to remain a member of the Correctional Officers' Retirement System ever		
32	though the member is promoted to a position in which the member must join the		
33	Employees' Pension System as a condition of employment.
