13 14 15	WHEREAS, It is the intention of the General Assembly that the amount of paper used by the Senate, the House of Delegates, and the Department of Legislative Services be reduced by 80% by 2018; and
16 17 18	WHEREAS, Reducing the amount of paper used by the General Assembly and the Department of Legislative Services would save upwards of \$200,000 per year based on current paper use; and
19	WHEREAS, The reduction would also benefit the environment; now, therefore,
20 21	SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Legislative Policy Committee shall:
