A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

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SmartStat Technical Assistance and Support Center

3 FOR the purpose of establishing the SmartStat Technical Assistance and Support 4 Center in the National Center for Smart Growth Research and Education at the 5 University of Maryland, College Park; requiring the SmartStat Technical 6 Assistance and Support Center to collect and organize certain data, publish the 7 collected data on a certain Web site, and assist local jurisdictions in including 8 certain measures and indicators in certain annual reports; requiring the 9 Governor to include in the State budget for certain years a certain appropriation to support the SmartStat Technical Assistance and Support Center; requiring 10 the SmartStat Technical Assistance and Support Center to report annually to 11 12 the Governor, the Smart Growth Subcabinet, the Maryland Sustainable Growth 13 Commission, and the General Assembly on the performance of smart growth in the State; and generally relating to the SmartStat Technical Assistance and 14 15 Support Center.

21 Preamble

WHEREAS, Chapters 178 and 179 of the Acts of the General Assembly of 2009 required local jurisdictions to include measures and indicators of progress towards the implementation of smart growth in annual reports to the Department of Planning; and

WHEREAS, The requirements of Chapters 178 and 179 of the Acts of the General Assembly of 2009 impose financial and technical capacity burdens on local jurisdictions; and

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1 2 3	WHEREAS, It is possible to promote data consistency and realize economies of scale in the centralized collection, organization, and dissemination of smart growth measures and indicators; and							
4 5 6	WHEREAS, The National Center for Smart Growth Research and Education at the University of Maryland, College Park has assembled considerable smart growth and land use data for the State; and							
7 8 9	WHEREAS, The National Center for Smart Growth Research and Education is nationally recognized as a leader in the development of smart growth and sustainability indicators; and							
10 11 12 13 14	WHEREAS, Establishing a SmartStat Technical Assistance and Support Center to build on the data resources and technical expertise of the staff of the National Center for Smart Growth Research and Education would assist local jurisdictions in fulfilling the reporting requirements under Chapters 178 and 179 of the Acts of the General Assembly of 2009; now, therefore,							
15 16	SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

19 20	(a) In this section, "National Center" means the National Center for Smart Growth Research and Education at the University of Maryland, College Park.							
21	(b) (1) The General Assembly finds that:							
22 23 24	(i) in addition to reporting on past land use indicators and measures, local jurisdictions should strive to achieve future land use goals that implement and achieve the visions in § 1–201 of this subtitle;							
25 26	(ii) a statewide land use goal that embodies the visions in § 1–201 of this subtitle and smart and sustainable growth should be established;							
27 28 29	(iii) the visions in § 1–201 of this subtitle will not be realized unless local jurisdictions set their own goal to make incremental progress towards achieving a statewide land use goal; and							

(iv) resources are necessary to achieve a statewide goal,

including funding for infrastructure inside the priority funding areas and land

preservation outside the priority funding areas.

1 2 3	(2) (i) The statewide land use goal is to increase the current percentage of growth inside the priority funding areas and to decrease the percentage of growth located outside the priority funding areas.
4 5	(ii) Local jurisdictions shall develop a percentage goal towards achieving the statewide goal.
6 7 8	(c) (1) Except as provided in paragraphs (2) and (3) of this subsection, the annual report required to be filed under $\S 1-207$ of this subtitle shall include the following measures and indicators:
9 10	(i) the amount, share, and net density of growth inside and outside the priority funding areas;
11 12	(ii) the creation of new lots and the issuance of residential and commercial building permits inside and outside the priority funding areas;
13 14	(iii) the development capacity analysis, updated every 3 years and whenever there is a significant change in zoning or land use patterns;
15 16	(iv) the number of acres preserved using local agricultural land preservation funding, if applicable; and
17 18	(v) the following information on achieving the statewide goal stated in subsection (b)(2) of this section:
19	1. the local goal;
20	2. the time frame for achieving the local goal;
21 22	3. the resources necessary for infrastructure inside the priority funding areas and land preservation outside the priority funding areas; and
23 24	4. any incremental progress made towards achieving the local goal.
25 26	(2) If all land within the boundaries of a municipal corporation is a priority funding area, the municipal corporation need not:
27 28	(i) establish a local goal for achieving the statewide goal stated in subsection (b)(2) of this section; or
29 30	(ii) include information in the annual report on a local goal as required in paragraph (1)(v) of this subsection.

(3) A county or municipal corporation that issues fewer than 50 building permits for new residential units each year:

- 3 (ii) shall provide documentation to the Department of Planning 4 each year that fewer than 50 building permits for new residential units are issued.
- 5 (D) (1) THERE IS A SMARTSTAT TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE AND 6 SUPPORT CENTER IN THE NATIONAL CENTER.
- 7 (2) THE SMARTSTAT TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE AND SUPPORT 8 CENTER SHALL:
- 9 (I) COLLECT AND ORGANIZE DATA FROM THE STATE, 10 LOCAL JURISDICTIONS, AND THE PRIVATE SECTOR;
- 11 (II) PUBLISH THE COLLECTED DATA ON A WEB SITE THAT IS
 12 LINKED TO THE DATA CENTER ON THE DEPARTMENT OF PLANNING WEB SITE
 13 AND ON THE BAYSTAT PROGRAM WEB SITE; AND
- 14 (III) ASSIST LOCAL JURISDICTIONS IN INCLUDING THE
 15 MEASURES AND INDICATORS REQUIRED UNDER SUBSECTION (C) OF THIS
 16 SECTION IN THE ANNUAL REPORTS REQUIRED UNDER § 1–207 OF THIS
 17 SUBTITLE.
- 18 (3) FOR FISCAL YEAR 2015 AND EACH FISCAL YEAR THEREAFTER,
 19 THE GOVERNOR SHALL INCLUDE IN THE STATE BUDGET AN APPROPRIATION OF
 20 \$150,000 TO THE UNIVERSITY OF MARYLAND, COLLEGE PARK TO SUPPORT
 21 THE SMARTSTAT TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE AND SUPPORT CENTER.
- 22 (4) THE SMARTSTAT TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE AND SUPPORT
 23 CENTER SHALL REPORT ANNUALLY TO THE GOVERNOR, THE SMART GROWTH
 24 SUBCABINET, THE MARYLAND SUSTAINABLE GROWTH COMMISSION AND, IN
 25 ACCORDANCE WITH § 2–1246 OF THE STATE GOVERNMENT ARTICLE, THE
 26 GENERAL ASSEMBLY ON THE PERFORMANCE OF SMART GROWTH IN THE STATE.
- [(d)] (E) (1) In accordance with Title 2, Subtitle 5 and Title 10, Subtitle 1 of the State Government Article, the Department of Planning may adopt regulations to detail how the measures and indicators required under subsection (c) of this section are submitted and transmitted in the annual report of each local jurisdiction.

6 7 8 9	[(e)] (F) On or before January 1 of each year, the Department of Planning, in consultation with the National Center, shall submit a report to the Governor and, in accordance with § 2–1246 of the State Government Article, to the General Assembly on the measures and indicators collected under this section.
