CHAPTER

1 AN ACT concerning

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2 Higher Education – Maryland Longitudinal Data System – Governing Board and Data Transfers

4 FOR the purpose of adding the President of the Maryland Independent College and 5 University Association, or the President's designee, to the Governing Board of 6 the Maryland Longitudinal Data System Center; requiring private nonprofit 7 institutions of higher education that receive State funds to transfer certain 8 student data to the Maryland Longitudinal Data System in accordance with a 9 certain plan; establishing that a certain institution of higher education or 10 postsecondary education that transfers or discloses student-level data to the 11 Maryland Longitudinal Data System in accordance with a certain plan is not 12 liable for a breach of confidentiality or a disclosure, use, retention, or destruction of the data that results from an act or omission by the Maryland 13 Longitudinal Data System Center, a State agency, or a certain person; 14 establishing that if the Maryland Independent College and University 15 16 Association transfers or discloses student-level data to the Maryland 17 Longitudinal Data System or a State agency on behalf of a private nonprofit 18 institution of higher education in accordance with a certain plan, the association 19 is not liable for a breach of confidentiality or a disclosure, use, retention, or 20 destruction of the data that results from an act or omission by the Maryland 21Longitudinal Data System Center, a State agency, or a certain person; and 22 generally relating to the Maryland Longitudinal Data System.

- 10 (c) (1) For-profit [and] INSTITUTIONS OF HIGHER EDUCATION, private nonprofit institutions of higher education THAT DO NOT RECEIVE STATE FUNDS, and institutions of postsecondary education that are required to register under § 11–202.2 of this article shall transfer student-level enrollment data, degree data, and financial aid data for all Maryland residents to the Maryland Longitudinal Data System in accordance with the data security and safeguarding plan developed under § 24–704(g)(6) of this subtitle.
