A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

Task Force to Evaluate Regional Health Delivery and Health Planning in Rural Areas

4 FOR the purpose of establishing the Task Force to Evaluate Regional Health Delivery $\mathbf{5}$ and Health Planning in Rural Areas; providing for the composition, cochairs, 6 and staffing of the Task Force; prohibiting a member of the Task Force from 7 receiving certain compensation, but authorizing the reimbursement of certain 8 expenses; requiring the Task Force to evaluate regional health delivery and 9 health planning in rural areas, with a certain emphasis, to include certain items in its evaluation, and to make certain recommendations; requiring the Task 10 Force to report its findings and recommendations to the Governor and certain 11 12legislative committees on or before a certain date; providing for the termination of this Act; and generally relating to the Task Force to Evaluate Regional 13 Health Delivery and Health Planning in Rural Areas. 14

15 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 16 MARYLAND, That:

17 (a) There is a Task Force to Evaluate Regional Health Delivery and Health18 Planning in Rural Areas.

19 (b) The Task Force consists of the following members:

(1) two members of the Senate of Maryland, both of whom shall
represent a rural jurisdiction in the State, and one of whom shall be a member of the
minority party of the Senate, appointed by the President of the Senate;

(2) two members of the House of Delegates, both of whom shall
represent a rural jurisdiction in the State, and one of whom shall be a member of the
minority party of the House, appointed by the Speaker of the House;

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1 (c) The President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House shall appoint 2 one member of the Senate of Maryland and one member of the House of Delegates, 3 respectively, to cochair the Task Force.

4 (d) The Department of Health and Mental Hygiene shall provide staff for the 5 Task Force.

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A member of the Task Force:

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(1) may not receive compensation as a member of the Task Force; but

8 (2) is entitled to reimbursement for expenses under the Standard 9 State Travel Regulations, as provided in the State budget.

11 (1) evaluate regional health delivery and health planning in rural 12 areas, with a specific emphasis on large hospital systems acquiring or affiliating with 13 smaller hospitals or hospital systems;

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include in its evaluation:

15 (i) the appropriateness of current designations of health 16 planning regions for particular health services in rural areas;

(ii) the adequacy of the health care workforce, particularly
among physicians, nurses, behavioral health care providers, and allied health
professionals, in rural areas;

20 (iii) the barriers to accessibility of health care services, due to 21 distance;

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(iv) the adequacy of transportation for health care services;

(v) the effect of the increasing concentration of hospital and other services under large urban-based hospital systems on availability and accessibility of health care services; and

(vi) the effect of changes in the health care delivery system on
 meeting the health care needs of rural areas; and

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(3) make recommendations for improvements.

(g) On or before January 1, 2014, the Task Force shall report its findings and
 recommendations to the Governor and, in accordance with § 2–1246 of the State
 Government Article, the Senate Finance Committee and the House Health and
 Government Operations Committee.

1 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 2 July 1, 2013. It shall remain effective for a period of 1 year and, at the end of June 30, 3 2014, with no further action required by the General Assembly, this Act shall be 4 abrogated and of no further force and effect.
