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## State Board of Physicians - Quasi-Judicial Powers - Revision

- 3 FOR the purpose of authorizing the State Board of Physicians to issue a cease and 4 desist order or obtain injunctive relief against an individual for taking any 5 action that may be for which the Board determines there is a preponderance of 6 evidence of grounds for discipline under a certain provision of law and that poses a certain risk to a patient; requiring the Board to adopt certain 8 regulations to carry out a certain provision of law; and generally relating to the 9 quasi-judicial powers of the State Board of Physicians.

- SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 15

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1 2 3 4	(a) Over the signature of an officer, the executive director, or the deputy director of the Board, the Board may issue subpoenas and administer oaths in connection with any investigation under this title and any hearings or proceedings before it.
5 6 7 8	(b) If, without lawful excuse, a person disobeys a subpoena from the Board or an order by the Board to take an oath or to testify or answer a question, then, on petition of the Board, a court of competent jurisdiction may punish the person as for contempt of court.
9 10 11	(c) If after due notice the individual against whom the action is contemplated fails or refuses to appear, nevertheless the Board may hear and determine the matter.
12 13 14	(d) (1) If the entry is necessary to carry out a duty under this title, the Board's executive director or other duly authorized agent or investigator of the Board may enter at any reasonable hour:
15	(i) A place of business of a licensed physician;
16 17 18	(ii) Private premises where the Board suspects that a person who is not licensed by the Board is practicing, attempting to practice, or offering to practice medicine, based on a formal complaint; or
19	(iii) Public premises.
20 21	(2) A person may not deny or interfere with an entry under this subsection.
22 23	(3) A person who violates any provision of this subsection is guilty of a misdemeanor and on conviction is subject to a fine not exceeding \$100.
24 25	(e) The Board may issue a cease and desist order or obtain injunctive relief <u>AGAINST AN INDIVIDUAL</u> for [practicing]:
26	(1) PRACTICING medicine without a license; OR
27	(2) TAKING ANY ACTION THAT:
28 29 30	(I) MAY BE FOR WHICH THE BOARD DETERMINES THERE IS A PREPONDERANCE OF EVIDENCE OF GROUNDS FOR DISCIPLINE UNDER § 14–404 OF THIS TITLE; AND

(II) POSES THAT POSES A SERIOUS RISK TO THE HEALTH, 32 SAFETY, AND WELFARE OF A PATIENT.
