CHAPTER _____

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Calvert County – Alcoholic Beverages – Sunday Sales**

3 FOR the purpose of making inapplicable in Calvert County the prohibition against a
4 holder of a Class B or Class C license from selling alcoholic beverages at a bar or
5 counter on Sunday; *making this Act an emergency measure*; and generally
6 relating to alcoholic beverages sales in Calvert County.

12 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
13 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

5 (II) A retail dealer holding a Class B or C license may not sell
6 any alcoholic beverage at a bar or counter on Sunday.

7 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act ~~shall take effect~~
8 ~~July 1, 2013~~ *is an emergency measure, is necessary for the immediate preservation of*
9 *the public health or safety, has been passed by a yea and nay vote supported by*
10 *three-fifths of all the members elected to each of the two Houses of the General*
11 *Assembly, and shall take effect from the date it is enacted.*
