## A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

## Public Education - Alternative Schooling

3 FOR the purpose of adding an exception to the requirement that certain students 4 attend a public school regularly during the entire school year; requiring the 5 State Department of Education to adopt certain standards for the suspension or 6 expulsion of a certain student under a certain provision of law and the 7 readmission of a certain student to a certain school; requiring county boards of 8 education and the Board of School Commissioners of Baltimore City to establish 9 alternative schooling for certain students under certain circumstances; authorizing a county superintendent to recommend the filing of a certain 10 complaint alleging delinquency under certain circumstances; defining certain 11 12 terms; prohibiting the implementation of certain provisions of this Act until 13 county boards of education, the Board of School Commissioners of Baltimore City, and the State Department of Education have met certain requirements; 14 and generally relating to alternative schooling for certain students. 15

- SECTION 5. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That Sections 1 through 3 of this Act may not be implemented until each county board of education, the Board of School Commissioners of Baltimore City, and the State Department of Education have met the requirements set forth under § 7–304.2 of the Education Article, as enacted by Section 4 of this Act. The State Department of Education is responsible for certifying compliance with those requirements.
- SECTION 6. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That Section 3 of this Act shall take effect July 1, 2017, the effective date of Section 2 of Chapter 494 of the Acts of the General Assembly of 2012. If the effective date of Section 2 of Chapter 494 is amended, Section 3 of this Act shall take effect on the taking effect of Section 2 of Chapter 494.
- SECTION 7. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That Section 2 of this Act shall take effect July 1, 2015, the effective date of Section 1 of Chapter 494 of the Acts of the General Assembly of 2012. If the effective date of Section 1 of Chapter 494 is amended, Section 2 of this Act shall take effect on the taking effect of Section 1 of Chapter 494.
- SECTION 8. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, except as provided in Sections 6 and 7 of this Act, this Act shall take effect July 1, 2013.
