1 AN ACT concerning

Evaluation of the Application of Minority Business Enterprise Program by the Public Service Commission

4 FOR the purpose of requiring the Department of Transportation, the Governor's Office $\mathbf{5}$ of Minority Affairs, and the Public Service Commission, in consultation with the 6 Office of the Attorney General, to evaluate the feasibility and constitutionality 7 of requiring the Commission to apply the provisions of a certain minority 8 business enterprise program when exercising certain authority; providing for 9 the termination of this Act; and generally relating to an evaluation of the 10 application of the State minority business enterprise program by the Public Service Commission in exercising certain authority. 11

12 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 13 MARYLAND, That:

14 (a) The Department of Transportation, the Governor's Office of Minority 15 Affairs, and the Public Service Commission, in consultation with the Office of the 16 Attorney General, shall evaluate whether requiring the Public Service Commission to 17 apply the provisions of the minority business enterprise program under Title 14, 18 Subtitle 3 of the State Finance and Procurement Article when exercising its authority 19 under § 7–510(c)(6) of the Public Utilities Article would be feasible and in compliance

3 (b) On or before December 1, 2013, the Department of Transportation, the 4 Governor's Office of Minority Affairs, and the Public Service Commission shall report 5 their findings and recommendations to the General Assembly in accordance with § 6 2–1246 of the State Government Article.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
July 1, 2013. It shall remain effective for a period of 1 year and, at the end of June 30,
2014, with no further action required by the General Assembly, this Act shall be
abrogated and of no further force and effect.
