2 Commission on the Commemoration of the Anniversary of the Passage of the 3 19th Amendment to the United States Constitution

FOR the purpose of establishing the Commission on the Commemoration of the 4 5 Anniversary of the Passage of the 19th Amendment to the United States 6 Constitution; providing for the composition, chair, and staffing of the 7 Commission; prohibiting a member of the Commission from receiving certain 8 compensation, but authorizing the reimbursement of certain expenses; 9 requiring the Commission to take certain actions and make recommendations 10 regarding certain matters; requiring the Commission to report its activities, findings, and recommendations to the Governor and the General Assembly on or 11 before a certain date and annually thereafter for a certain period of time; 12 13 providing for the termination of this Act; and generally relating to the 14 Commission on the Commemoration of the Anniversary of the Passage of the 15 19th Amendment to the United States Constitution.

1 2 3	WHEREAS, The 19th Amendment to the United States Constitution giving American women the right to vote was passed by both houses of the United States Congress in 1919; and
4 5 6	WHEREAS, Maryland's representatives Senator Joseph I. France and Congressmen William Andrews, John Linthicum, and Frederick Zihlman voted in favor of the resolution that sent the proposed amendment to the states; and
7 8 9	WHEREAS, The 19th Amendment was ratified by the State of Tennessee on August 18, 1920, making it the 36th state to ratify the amendment and provided the final ratification necessary to enact the amendment; and
10 11 12	WHEREAS, Maryland and its citizens played an important role in the cause of suffrage for women, including serving as the final stretch of the 1913 March for Women's Suffrage from Newark, New Jersey, to Washington, D.C.; and

- 5 (1) ASSEMBLE AN INVENTORY OF SITES IN MARYLAND THAT ARE SIGNIFICANT TO THE WOMEN'S SUFFRAGE MOVEMENT AND THE RATIFICATION OF THE 19TH AMENDMENT TO THE UNITED STATES CONSTITUTION;
- 8 (2) DEVELOP A PLAN FOR COMMEMORATING THE EVENTS THAT
 9 OCCURRED IN MARYLAND CONNECTED TO THE WOMEN'S SUFFRAGE MOVEMENT

- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 2013. It shall remain effective for a period of 7 years and 4 months and, at the end of October 31, 2020, with no further action required by the General Assembly, this Act shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.
