CHAPTER

## 1 AN ACT concerning

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## Commission to Study the Regulation of Payroll Services

- 3 FOR the purpose of establishing the Commission to Study the Regulation of Payroll 4 Services; providing for the composition, chair, and staffing of the Commission; prohibiting a member of the Commission from receiving certain compensation, 5 6 but authorizing the reimbursement of certain expenses; requiring the 7 Commission to study and make recommendations regarding certain matters; 8 requiring the Commission to report its findings and recommendations to certain 9 committees of the General Assembly on or before a certain date; providing for 10 the termination of this Act; and generally relating to the Commission to Study the Regulation of Payroll Services. 11
- 12 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 13 MARYLAND, That:
  - (a) There is a Commission to Study the Regulation of Payroll Services.
  - (b) The Commission consists of the following members:
- 16 (1) one member of the Senate of Maryland, appointed by the President 17 of the Senate;
