

Chapter 227

(Senate Bill 315)

AN ACT concerning

Frederick County – Gaming Permits

FOR the purpose of repealing in Frederick County a certain limitation on the number of certain raffles that may be held on a single day; authorizing the Board of County Commissioners of Frederick County to determine the number of permits to conduct a raffle that certain organizations in Frederick County may receive in a calendar year; and generally relating to raffles in Frederick County.

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

Article – Criminal Law

13–1304.

(a) Before an organization listed in subsection (b) of this section may conduct a gaming event, the organization shall obtain a permit from the county agency that the county commissioners designate.

(b) An organization may conduct a gaming event for its own benefit if the organization is:

- (1) a bona fide:
 - (i) religious organization;
 - (ii) fraternal organization;
 - (iii) civic organization;
 - (iv) war veterans' organization;
 - (v) hospital;
 - (vi) amateur athletic organization;
 - (vii) patriotic organization;
 - (viii) educational organization; or
 - (ix) charitable organization;
- (2) a Frederick County volunteer:
 - (i) fire company;
 - (ii) rescue company; or
 - (iii) ambulance company; or
- (3) an auxiliary for a Frederick County volunteer:
 - (i) fire company;
 - (ii) rescue company; or
 - (iii) ambulance company.

(f) (2) During each calendar year, the holder of a gaming event, including a raffle for which the prize drawings are held on a single day, may not hold or receive the proceeds from[:

(i)] more than one gaming event in which the major prize has a value of more than \$5,000[; and

(ii) more than five raffles for which the prize drawings are held on a single day and in which the major prize has a value of \$5,000 or less].

(4) THE COUNTY COMMISSIONERS MAY REGULATE THE NUMBER OF PERMITS TO CONDUCT A RAFFLE THAT AN ORGANIZATION MAY RECEIVE IN 1 CALENDAR YEAR.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 2013.
