Montgomery County - Board of Education Districts - Town of Kensington in One District MC 1-13

This emergency bill alters two Montgomery County Board of Education districts such that residents of the Town of Kensington are within one (District 3), instead of two (District 3 and District 4), board of education districts. Specifically, election district 13, precinct 34 is placed entirely within board of education District 3 by removing that part of precinct 34 that currently falls within board of education District 4.

Fiscal Summary

State Effect: None.

Local Effect: The Montgomery County Board of Elections will incur approximately \$500 in one-time expenditures to produce and mail notification to approximately 900 individuals regarding their new polling place. The board can make adjustments to board of education districts with existing resources.

Small Business Effect: None.

Analysis

Current Law: The Montgomery County Board of Education consists of seven elected members (two are elected from the county at large; five from separate board of education districts) as well as one student member. Redistricting of board of education districts occurs every 10 years, following the decennial Census.

Chapter 2 of the 2011 special session (SB 2) provided for redistricting of board of education districts in Montgomery County. Chapter 2, among other provisions, divided election district 13, precinct 34 between board of education District 3 and District 4.

Background: The Montgomery County Board of Education is 1 of 18 elected school boards in the State. There are four appointed school boards in the State and two counties have hybrid boards including both elected and appointed members. The **Appendix** – **Local Boards of Education** shows the selection methods, terms of office, and membership of the 24 local school boards.
