#### FISCAL AND POLICY NOTE

House Bill 901 Economic Matters (Howard County Delegation)

Education, Health, and Environmental Affairs

#### Howard County - Alcoholic Beverages Establishments - Distance from Schools

This bill alters the minimum distance restriction in Howard County so that a Class B license to sell alcoholic beverages may not be granted for a restaurant located within 400 feet from the nearest point of a public school building.

The bill takes effect July 1, 2013.

#### **Fiscal Summary**

State Effect: None.

**Local Effect:** None. Altering an existing restriction will not materially impact Howard County's operations or finances.

**Small Business Effect:** Overall minimal, but potential meaningful for establishments that are able to obtain an alcoholic beverages license under the bill.

### Analysis

**Current Law:** A license to sell alcoholic beverages in Howard County may not be first issued after June 30, 1971, for any building located within 500 feet of the nearest point of a public school building.

**Background:** There are 270 alcoholic beverages licenses in Howard County, of which 161 are Class B licenses.
