#### FISCAL AND POLICY NOTE

House Bill 922 Environmental Matters (Delegate Kach)

#### **Public Health - Feral Cats - Rabies Vaccinations**

This bill requires a feral cat caregiver who provides care to (or has temporary custody of) a feral cat to make every reasonable effort to ensure that (1) the feral cat is vaccinated for rabies and subsequently ear-tipped and (2) there is a written record of the feral cat's vaccination.

### **Fiscal Summary**

**State Effect:** The Department of Health and Mental Hygiene can use existing resources to assist local health departments with enforcement, to the extent necessary.

**Local Effect:** Enforcement can likely be handled with existing resources, assuming enforcement is complaint-based.

Small Business Effect: None.

### Analysis

**Current Law:** A person who owns or keeps a cat that is age four months or older must have the cat vaccinated adequately against rabies.
