Girl Scouts of Central Maryland (GSCM) is one of the largest Girl Scout Councils in the UnitedStates with a membership of nearly 27,000 girls supported by 10,000 volunteers all residing in thestate of Maryland. The council area encompasses Baltimore City and the counties of AnneArundel, Baltimore, Carroll, Harford and Howard. Girl Scouts of Central Maryland operates fromoffices in Baltimore City and is the only Girl Scout Council headquartered in the state ofMaryland. The Girl Scout program is the nation's premier leadership development programdedicated to the development of the full potential of girls and young women from all racial, ethnic,religious and socio-economic groups. In Girl Scouting, girls are taught leadership and life skillsthat include goal-setting, service to the community, anti-violence, anti-bullying/ cyber-bullying anddrug education, healthy living and self-acceptance. We are proud of the fact that 12% of all girls incentral Maryland, ages 5 through 17, are Girl Scouts. Nationally, only 9% of all girls are GirlScouts. Girl Scouts of Central Maryland owns its Baltimore City headquarters and four campproperties in Anne Arundel (2 camps), Howard (1 camp) and Cecil Counties (1								

11. Description and Purpose of Project (Limit Length to Visible area)

Girl Scouts of Central Maryland (GSCM) has capital infrastructure needs at Camp Woodlands, a34-acre camp located in Anne Arundel County which was purchased in 1944. Camp Woodlands is a highly utilized property, serving 19,001 people last year. Lamb's Lodge, the Tee Pee, is utilized five days a week by Arlington Echo for outdoor educational programming for youth in Anne Arundel County. Camp Woodlands is utilized by three partners annually in addition to the Girl Scout membership throughout our Council, Arlington Echo, Annapolis Junior Rowing Club and The Y of Central Maryland. Girl Scout troops utilize the facility Friday - Sunday for troop camping throughout the year as well as in evenings for meetings and activities. The camp is used for various summer programming options. This facility is a unique architectural design that was ahead of its time when envisioned. Preserving the integrity of the structure will allow for many more years to come for Girl Scouts and the community at large. GSCMs vision is to return the Tee Pee to its original glory to host day and/or resident camp (overnight camping) for girls. Exposing girls to the great outdoors is critical today! Serving girls in outdoor activities in a safe and nurturing environment improves their health and self-esteem.

Camp Woodlands is a 34-acre site located on Broad Creek which after joining South River, flows into the Chesapeake Bay in Annapolis, Maryland, Camp Woodlands is home to the nationally acclaimed Tee Pee (Lambs Lodge,) a 12-sided polygon with a central fireplace received an Award of Merit from the American Institute of Architects in 1954. Visit our Lambs Lodge web site page, http://gscm.org/about/facilities/camp-woodlands/lambs-lodge/ to learn more about the facility. Facilities Include: Two year around lodge, one seasonal lodge, Program center, Four seasonal units, Waterfront access with pier/dock, Nature trails, Friendship Knot (small raised stage in the woods.) What is the nugget in the Lamb Lodge story that makes it relevant todaywhat is the going forward story? Unique design of the building was forward thinkingwell before its time just as was Juliette Gordon Lows vision for Girl Scouting 100 years ago was ahead of its time. Camp continues to be an important tradition and learning experience outdoor education and camping experiences help girls adjust to new experiences, test their boundaries, explore nature and understand the environment. May 1, 1954 the first dedication ceremony took place for the younger girls and on May 15th the older girls. (58 years is significant and a good tie for our anniversary) Of note - in 1954 Mr. Charles Lamb submitted for and was awarded the Award of Merit for Excellence in Architectural Design at the annual A.I.A. Convention. (AIA American Institute of Architects) An interesting point in design is the circle symbolizing friendship and unity, a theme that is central to Girl Scouting. What are the current issues with the structure? Replace support beams - exterior Paint - Repaint interior & exterior replace rotted wood panels throughout the facility Replace Entrance Doors Repair and/or replace flooring Repair Fire Flu for ventilation Remove modified roof structure and replace with design similar to the original roof structure Repair and/or replace windows Replace light fixtures pendant lights and cove lighting Skylights Replace existing with fire glass code compliant Refurbish and/or replace tables and benches Landscaping Establish walking pathways and add exterior lighting along pathways Kitchen / Bathroom Space - Review current codes and/or ways to expand use of these areasCompeted to Date: Beams were the top priority and they were replaced with funding from a donor The light fixtures have been replaced with funding from a donor
