10. Description and Purpose of Grantee Organization (Limit Length to Visible area)

The Kingsville Volunteer Fire Company (KVFC), Inc. is a dynamic volunteer organization, deeply entrenched in traditional hometown values, who on a daily basis, protect lives and property by offering exemplary, prompt, and skillful Fire/Rescue/EMS life saving services. Of particular and vital note is:* Serving all citizens in the immediate and surrounding communities along Bel Air Rd., Harford Rd., and I95 Corridors for over 50 years, the (KVFC) serves ever-increasing needs (2350 response calls in 2011).* A Cadet Youth Program provides training, leadership, and character in youth 10-16 years old.* The KVFC is distinguished by choosing to remain an all-volunteer force of Fire/Rescue/EMS service. The KVFC is one of a few national recognized Swiftwater/Flood response teams in the state of Maryland. All funds received are contributed to the operational budget.* The traditional, pioneering, and multi-generational spirit of volunteerism that created KVFC will be extended and renewed by the successful completion of this building expansion project.

Because of the ever-increasing need for assistance in this area, the KVFC has committed to the challenges and opportunity of expanding its facility so that the company may more fully serve the needs of the community's citizens. With new space, the company will have an even more positive impact on the region as a whole. The 22,000 square foot LEED construction and renovation is scheduled to begin August 2013 with a oner year completion goal:* Training/Community Roomfire/rescue/ems classes, disaster housing, back-up command center;* Kitchen & Bathroomsincrease number of 24 hour responders & serve disaster victims;* Conference Room-location of community meetings and emergency/disaster planning;* Power Generator- continued operation during disaster & shelter for disaster victims;* Equipment Response Bays- added storage & venting to eliminate overcrowding to preserve equipment and provide a safe environment for responding apparatus and personnel. * Office & Dispatch- increase building security, safety, planning, and dispatch.

The Kingsville Volunteer Fire Company (KVFC) is a volunteer organization with over 100 members that proudly serves and provides professional Fire, Rescue, EMS services to the residents of the Kingsville community, Northeast Baltimore County, Southern and Central Harford County as well as the surrounding metropolitan area. KVFC also provides Heavy Rescue services to the busy corridors or I95, Belair and Harford roads and CSX rail line. KVFC is one of a few fire companies in Maryland with a Swiftwater/Flood Rescue team that responds regionally and throughout the Mid-Atlantic area. It is our mission of KVFC to provide help to any citizen in these response areas. Kingsville Volunteer Fire Company has been providing these services for over 50 years. Each year, the number of people whose lives are affected increases and our services are needed more and more. The Kingsville Volunteer Fire Company cannot afford to have a decline in our services simply because our facility is becoming inoperable. Because of the increasing need for assistance, we have committed to the challenge and opportunity of expanding our facility so we may fully serve the needs of our citizens. The Kingsville Volunteer Fire Company has always been a focal point of the community. The fire station has been a place of heart and soul for our citizens, providing times of fellowship during pancake breakfasts, to a safe refuge in time of disasters. This type of outreach was recently witnessed in Newtown Connecticut during the Sandy Hook Elementary School shooting incident. The volunteer fire station provided a place of immediate safety and gathering of the frantic parents and community residents. The fire station also provided a place for an incident command center, media relations, and a place for town residents to comfort each other. Without a moment's thought, the citizens, police, and school officials in Newtown knew that the place to gather and accommodate such a tragedy would be the community fire station. Since this unfortunate incident, the Kingsville Volunteer Fire Company has been contacted by several private schools in our community requesting to use our facility much like the volunteer fire station was used in Newtown Connecticut. With renovations and addition of new space, KVFC will be able to accommodate such request, and serve more people which will have a residual positive impact on the region as a whole. The manner in which we meet this challenge will stand as a measure of our values and as a tangible statement of our commitment to the future of KVFC and the communities we serve. The Kingsville Volunteer Fire Company is hopeful that the Maryland legislators will share in the renewal of the pioneering spirit that created KVFC over 50 years ago and built the wonderful company we are today.
