10. Description and Purpose of Grantee Organization (Limit Length to Visible area)

Cheverly American Legion is a Non Profit Organization of Veterans who served during a wartime period. The Post was first organized in 1933 and the Post Building was completed in 1941. We exist to take care of our fellow Veterans, Mentor the Youth of our Country, and Promote Patriotism, Honor and a Strong National Security. Our Post must be here for Veterans returning from current and future conflicts - as we are all volunteers helping each other deal with the conflicts we all fought in. For decades we have been the center of activities for the Town of Cheverly to include recent storms where we opened our doors to citizens without power. The facility is consistently used by numerous non-profit organizations in Prince Georges County to include our own Boy Scout Troop 257 and our Cub Scout Pack 257. Community groups use our facility for numerous causes such as weeklong Peace Camps - teaching our youth how to deal with violence. Other groups hold ceremonies/classes for Black History Month, Job fairs for jobless and homeless Veterans, Red Cross classes for the community, and a conference for all local community schools.

11. Description and Purpose of Project (Limit Length to Visible area)

The Post Building was completed in 1941; built by World War I Veterans of materials collected from Rock Creek Park, the East Wing of the White House, a bridge in Washington DC, and contains old doors from the U.S. Supreme Court. In essence this building is truly historic and our goal is to make it the shinning building it once was - so we can continue to be the center of volunteer activities for the Community and our Veterans who fought for our Country. We hope to secure funding primarily to replace our roof (which is over 30 years old) and is leaking. We did patch work but our insurance company is saying the entire roof needs to be replaced or they will drop our insurance. We also hope to secure funding to repair our refrigeration room which has major cracks in the walls and ceiling; repairs will lower the utility bills and will ensure the walls and ceiling do not collapse. The kitchen in the building also needs to be brought up to Fire Code with an updated Fire Suppression System. The sewage pipes leading from the building to the main sewage pipes also needs work - as our volunteers have had to snake the sewers too often. Finally in an effort to improve the appearance of the Hall we need to replace over 30 year old rugs.
