10. Description and Purpose of Grantee Organization (Limit Length to Visible area)

Living Classrooms Foundation was founded in Baltimore, Maryland in 1985 with a philosophy based on the concept that every student can reach their potential even those residing in distressed communities, if provided a continuum of resources and quality programming that are effective, efficient and structured. Our programs offer distinctive competency in experiential learning-literally learning by direct experience, or what the Foundation calls "learning by doing." Each of our programs are distinct, the combination creates a powerful synergy. Our education programs use various settings as living learning environments. Our enrichment programs reinforce academic skills, positive and healthy lifestyles, and direct stewardship. Our employability programs produce individuals that are better prepared to exercise community stewardship. The Ralph J. Young Recreational Center, which was closed and abandoned by Baltimore City Housing, is connected to Commodore John Rodgers Elementary/Middle School. This facility will expand Living Classrooms' cradle to college continuum of solutions to now include an Early Childhood component.

11. Description and Purpose of Project (Limit Length to Visible area)

Living Classrooms currently is the operator of Commodore John Rodgers, which is connected to the facility, and has a unique opportunity to transform this site into an early childhood & family support center providing services for families in the area.

The revitalization and transformation of the Ralph J. Young Center into an Early Childhood Center will target parents and their children from birth through age five who will be transitioning to East Baltimore k-8 schools. The Center will be operated by Kennedy Krieger Early Head Start program in partnership with Maryland Family Network and the Johns Hopkins School of Education. Additionally, the Early Childhood facility will be the site of a Judy Center. The capital funds for this project will be funded through the Harry and Jeanette Weinberg Foundation and Baltimore City Public Schools. The operating budget will be funded through MSDE, Baltimore Community Foundation, Early Head Start, Head Start, and Kennedy Krieger support. Initial Community assessment data revealed for the four census tracks surrounding Commodore John Rodgers the birth rate has been rising from 2007-2010. In 2007 there were 214 reported births and 232 births in 2010.
