Rules and Executive Nominations

State Designations - State Sandwich - Soft-Shell Crab Sandwich

This bill designates the soft-shell crab sandwich as the State sandwich.

Fiscal Summary

State Effect: Designating a State sandwich does not affect State finances.

Local Effect: None.

Small Business Effect: None.

Analysis

Current Law: The Maryland State Flag was adopted in 1904 followed by the adoption of the Black-eyed Susan as the State flower in 1918. Since then, the State has adopted many additional official symbols, as shown in **Exhibit 1**. The Governor is also authorized to designate a citizen as the State's Poet Laureate.

Background: Blue crabs and Maryland have long been associated. The brackish waters of the Chesapeake Bay provide an ideal habitat, and they are the State's most valuable commercial fishery. In 1989, the Blue Crab was designated the State Crustacean.

Blue crabs are harvested as hard-shell crabs, peeler crabs (just prior to molting), and soft-shell crabs (immediately after the molt). Soft-shell crabs are generally only available during the summer months, and although the molting process can take a few days, the shells are soft for only a few hours.

Soft-shell crab sandwiches are generally quite simple. A traditional sandwich consists of a breaded and fried soft-shell crab between two slices of white bread or toast. Lettuce and tomato are common additions; there also maybe a squirt of lemon, Old Bay seasoning, or some tartar sauce. The focus of the sandwich is the sweet and savory meat of the crab and the crunch of the soft shell.
