### FISCAL AND POLICY NOTE

Senate Bill 7 (Senator Reilly) Education, Health, and Environmental Affairs

#### **State Government - Commemorative Month - Irish American Heritage Month**

This bill requires the Governor to annually proclaim the month of March as Irish American Heritage Month and to urge educational and cultural organizations to observe Irish American Heritage Month with appropriate programs, ceremonies, and activities.

## **Fiscal Summary**

**State Effect:** Commemorating Irish American Heritage Month does not affect State finances.

Local Effect: None.

Small Business Effect: None.

## **Analysis**

**Current Law:** Nine official commemorative days and three months are recognized in State law as shown in **Exhibit 1**. The Governor also must issue a proclamation each year encouraging citizens and other individuals to observe a moment of silence at 3 p.m. on Memorial Day to unite in remembrance and commemorate the heroic acts and efforts of Marylanders who have served and died in the U.S. Armed Forces.

**Background:** Irish Americans comprise one of the largest self-reported ancestral groups in the State, as well as in the nation. According to the U.S. Census Bureau, more than 10% of Marylanders are of Irish American descent. Irish Americans have been highly influential in American history and society, and a number of Irish American parades are

held annually in major cities across the United States to celebrate St. Patrick's Day in March.

The U.S. Congress first designated March as Irish American Heritage Month in 1991. Each year since 1991, the President of the United States has annually proclaimed March to be Irish American Heritage Month.
