A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

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Contraband Tobacco Products and Conveyances – Seizures and Disposition

- 3 FOR the purpose of altering the manner in which seized contraband tobacco products 4 or certain conveyances are processed following seizure; authorizing the 5 Comptroller to destroy, or authorize a political subdivision to destroy, 6 contraband tobacco products or certain conveyances seized and forfeited under 7 certain circumstances; requiring the Comptroller to remove or authorize a 8 political subdivision to destroy certain seized contraband tobacco products and 9 conveyances on or before a certain date; and generally relating to the disposition 10 of seized contraband tobacco products and conveyances.

- 21 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
- 22 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
- 23 Article Tax General
- 24 13-836.

- 1 (b) (1) A police officer who seizes a conveyance used to transport 2 contraband alcoholic beverages promptly shall notify the Comptroller of the seizure.
- 3 (2) A police officer who seizes any contraband tobacco products or 4 conveyance used to transport contraband tobacco products **PROMPTLY** shall [deliver 5 the seized cigarettes or other tobacco products and conveyance to] **NOTIFY** the 6 Comptroller **OF THE SEIZURE**.
- 7 (3) A police officer who seizes any contraband motor fuel shall:
- 8 (i) deliver the seized contraband motor fuel and conveyance to 9 the Comptroller; or
- 10 (ii) if the seized conveyance is operated by a common carrier, 11 regulated by either the Maryland Public Service Commission or the Interstate 12 Commerce Commission, and transports motor fuel for another person, for a fee, direct 13 the operator of the conveyance to take it to a location that the Comptroller designates.
- 14 **(D)** FOR SEIZED CONTRABAND TOBACCO PRODUCTS OR A SEIZED CONVEYANCE USED TO TRANSPORT CONTRABAND TOBACCO PRODUCTS, THE COMPTROLLER SHALL:
- 17 (1) (I) REMOVE THE CONTRABAND OR CONVEYANCE FROM THE
 18 POLITICAL SUBDIVISION EXERCISING JURISDICTION OVER THE CONTRABAND
 19 OR CONVEYANCE WITHIN 60 DAYS AFTER THE CONTRABAND OR CONVEYANCE IS
 20 NO LONGER NEEDED AS EVIDENCE; AND
- 21 (II) DISPOSE OF THE CONTRABAND OR CONVEYANCE IN THE 22 MANNER AUTHORIZED UNDER § 13–841 OF THIS SUBTITLE; OR
- 23 (2) AUTHORIZE THE POLITICAL SUBDIVISION EXERCISING 24 JURISDICTION OVER THE CONTRABAND OR CONVEYANCE TO DESTROY THE 25 CONTRABAND OR CONVEYANCE.

- 27 (a) (1) Contraband alcoholic beverages that are seized under this title and 28 forfeited may be disposed of or destroyed in the manner allowed under Article 2B, § 29 1–201(f)(5) and (6) and (g) of the Code.
- 30 (2) The Comptroller shall sell at public auction a conveyance that is seized under this title in connection with contraband alcoholic beverages and forfeited.
- 32 (b) (1) (I) [The] EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN SUBPARAGRAPH (II) OF 33 THIS PARAGRAPH, THE Comptroller shall sell contraband tobacco products seized

- under this title and forfeited to a State institution, a nonprofit charitable institution, a 1 2 licensed cigarette wholesaler, or a licensed cigarette manufacturer in the manner the 3 Comptroller determines. 4 IF PROHIBITED FROM SELLING OR UNABLE TO MAKE A (II)5 PROFIT FROM SELLING THE SEIZED AND FORFEITED TOBACCO PRODUCTS IN 6 THE STATE, THE COMPTROLLER MAY: 7 1. DESTROY CONTRABAND **TOBACCO PRODUCTS** 8 SEIZED AND FORFEITED UNDER THIS TITLE; OR 9 2. AUTHORIZE **POLITICAL** TO Α SUBDIVISION 10 DESTROY CONTRABAND TOBACCO PRODUCTS SEIZED AND FORFEITED UNDER 11 THIS TITLE. 12 **(2)** [The] EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN SUBPARAGRAPH (II) OF **(I)** 13 THIS PARAGRAPH, THE Comptroller shall sell at public auction a conveyance that is 14 seized under this title in connection with contraband tobacco products and forfeited. 15 IF PROHIBITED FROM SELLING OR UNABLE TO MAKE A 16 PROFIT FROM SELLING THE SEIZED AND FORFEITED CONVEYANCE IN THE 17 STATE, THE COMPTROLLER MAY: 18 THE 1. **AND DESTROY CONVEYANCE SEIZED** 19 FORFEITED UNDER THIS TITLE; OR 20 2. **AUTHORIZE** A **POLITICAL SUBDIVISION** TO 21DESTROY THE CONVEYANCE SEIZED AND FORFEITED UNDER THIS TITLE. 22(1) If either the Comptroller or, on appeal, a court determines that 23 seized conveyance or motor fuel is not subject to forfeiture: 24the Comptroller is not required to return the motor fuel 25 seized to the owner or other interested person who filed the claim for return of the 26 property, but may, at the option of the Comptroller, pay to the person an amount equal 27 to the value of the motor fuel as determined by the average wholesale value on the 28 date of seizure for the Baltimore Terminal as reported by a nationally recognized oil
- 30 (ii) the Comptroller shall return the conveyance to the 31 registered owner and shall have no further liability to the registered owner.

AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That on or before December 1, 2014, the Comptroller shall remove any seized contraband tobacco products and conveyances that are no longer needed as evidence from the possession of a political subdivision exercising jurisdiction over the seized contraband tobacco products and conveyances or authorize the political subdivision exercising jurisdiction over the seized contraband tobacco products and conveyances to dispose of the contraband tobacco products and conveyances.
