## 13 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 14 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

  17 (a) A person, INCLUDING A MEMBER OF A NEIGHBORHOOD WATCH
  18 ORGANIZATION, may not follow another in or about a public place or maliciously
  - 19 engage in a course of conduct that alarms or seriously annoys the other:
  - 20
- (1) with the intent to harass, alarm, or annoy the other;

21 (2) after receiving a reasonable warning or request to stop by or on22 behalf of the other; and

8 9	(2) for a second or subsequent offense, imprisonment not exceeding [180 days] <b>1 YEAR</b> or a fine not exceeding \$1,000 or both.
