A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Procurement Advisory Council – Membership**

3 FOR the purpose of adding the Secretary of Information Technology as a member of
4 the Procurement Advisory Council; and generally relating to the Procurement
5 Advisory Council.

16 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
17 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

18 **Article – State Finance and Procurement**

19 12–105.

21 (c) (1) The Council consists of the following [ten] 11 members:

- 5 (v) **THE SECRETARY OF INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY;**
- 6 **(VI)** the Secretary of Transportation;
- 7 **[(vi)] (VII)** the Secretary of the Board;
- 8 **[(vii)] (VIII)** the Special Secretary for the Office of Minority
9 Affairs;
- 10 **[(viii)] (IX)** a representative of local government who has
11 expertise in local procurement matters, appointed by the Governor with the advice and
12 consent of the Senate; and
- 13 **[(ix)] (X)** two members of the general public, at least one of
14 whom has expertise in State procurement matters, appointed by the Governor with
15 the advice and consent of the Senate.

16 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
17 July 1, 2014.
