## Task Force to Study the Impact of Ocean Acidification on State Waters

5 FOR the purpose of requiring the Department of the Environment to include an 6 analysis of the best available science regarding ocean acidification and certain 7 potential effects of acidification in a certain report; requiring the Department to 8 make recommendations on potential strategies to mitigate certain effects of 9 ocean acidification in a certain report; and generally relating to ocean 10 acidification establishing the Task Force to Study the Impact of Ocean Acidification on State Waters; providing for the composition, chair, and staffing 11 12 of the Task Force; prohibiting a member of the Task Force from receiving certain compensation, but authorizing the reimbursement of certain expenses; 13 requiring the Task Force to analyze certain information and make 14 recommendations regarding certain matters; requiring the Task Force to report 15 its findings and recommendations to the Governor and the General Assembly on 16 17 or before a certain date; providing for the termination of this Act; and generally 18 relating to the Task Force to Study the Impact of Ocean Acidification on State 19 Waters.
