Vehicle Laws - Seat Belt Use - Exemption for Individuals Delivering Printed Publications

 course of the individual's employment, is delivering printed publications along a
 specified route under certain circumstances; and generally relating to seat belt

- 19 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 20 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

Article – Transportation

(b) A person may not operate a motor vehicle unless the person and each
occupant under 16 years old are restrained by a seat belt or a child safety seat as
provided in § 22-412.2 of this subtitle.

1 (c) (1) The provisions of this subsection apply to a person who is at least 2 16 years old.

3 (2) Unless a person is restrained by a seat belt, the person may not be 4 a passenger in an outboard front seat of a motor vehicle.

5 (3) (i) Unless a person is restrained by a seat belt, the person may 6 not be a passenger in a rear seat of a motor vehicle.

7 (ii) A police officer may enforce this paragraph only as a 8 secondary action when the police officer detains a driver of a motor vehicle for a 9 suspected violation of another provision of the Code.

10 (f) The provisions of this section do not apply to:

11 (1) U.S. Postal Service and contract carriers while delivering mail to 12 local box routes; **OR**

13 (2) AN INDIVIDUAL WHO, IN THE REGULAR COURSE OF THE 14 INDIVIDUAL'S EMPLOYMENT, IS DELIVERING NEWSPAPERS, PHONE BOOKS, OR 15 OTHER PRINT PUBLICATIONS ALONG A SPECIFIED ROUTE REQUIRING 16 FREQUENT VEHICLE STOPS INVOLVING THE INDIVIDUAL'S EXIT FROM AND 17 REENTRY INTO THE VEHICLE, PROVIDED THAT THE SPEED OF THE VEHICLE 18 BETWEEN STOPS DOES NOT EXCEED 15 MILES PER HOUR.

19 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect20 October 1, 2014.
