- 4 FOR the purpose of requiring a county to cause the POW/MIA flag to be flown on the 5 grounds of a certain county building whenever the flag of the United States is 6 flown; requiring the Secretary of General Services and the Secretary of 7 Transportation to cause the POW/MIA flag to be flown on the grounds of certain 8 buildings whenever the flag of the United States is flown; requiring that the POW/MIA flag be flown from the State House as provided in a certain provision 9 of law; making conforming changes; providing for the application of this Act; 10 defining a certain term; and generally relating to the display of the POW/MIA 11 12 flag on the grounds of State and county buildings.
