# A BILL ENTITLED

#### 1 AN ACT concerning

# 2 Task Force to Study How to Improve Student Achievement in Middle School

- 3 FOR the purpose of establishing the Task Force to Study How to Improve Student 4 Achievement in Middle School; providing for the composition, chair, and staffing  $\mathbf{5}$ of the Task Force; prohibiting a member of the Task Force from receiving 6 certain compensation, but authorizing the reimbursement of certain expenses; 7 requiring the Task Force to study a certain report and make recommendations 8 regarding certain matters; requiring the Task Force to report its findings and 9 recommendations to the Governor and the General Assembly on or before a 10 certain date; providing for the termination of this Act; and generally relating to the Task Force to Study How to Improve Student Achievement in Middle 11 12 School.
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# Preamble

WHEREAS, In 2011, the Southern Regional Education Board's (SREB) Middle
Grades Commission published a comprehensive report titled, "A New Mission for the
Middle Grades"; and

WHEREAS, The SREB report focuses on the mission to build a strong
foundation to prepare students for success in high school, so that more students will
graduate from high school and proceed to college or technical training; and

WHEREAS, The SREB report suggests that students should begin to make a connection between their learning experiences in middle school and their pathway through high school to college, technical training, or a career; and

WHEREAS, Research further indicates students and parents are underexposed
 to the opportunities available through career and technical education; and
