A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Labor and Employment – Training Wage for New Employees – Establishment**
3 **and Payment**

4 FOR the purpose of authorizing a county to establish a training wage for certain
5 employees; prohibiting the training wage from being less than a certain
6 minimum wage; authorizing an employer to pay a training wage to certain
7 employees for a certain period of time; and generally relating to the
8 establishment and payment of a training wage for new employees.

14 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
15 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

16 **Article – Labor and Employment**

17 3–413.

18 (a) In this section, “employer” includes a governmental unit.

19 (b) Except as provided in **SUBSECTION (C) OF THIS SECTION OR § 3–414** of
20 this subtitle, each employer shall pay:

1 (1) to each employee who is subject to both the federal Act and this
2 subtitle, at least the greater of:

3 (i) the minimum wage for that employee under the federal Act;
4 or

5 (ii) a wage that equals a rate of \$6.15 per hour; and

6 (2) each other employee who is subject to this subtitle, at least:

7 (i) the greater of:

8 1. the highest minimum wage under the federal Act; or

9 2. a wage that equals a rate of \$6.15 per hour; or

10 (ii) a training wage under regulations that the Commissioner
11 adopts that include the conditions and limitations authorized under the federal Fair
12 Labor Standards Amendments of 1989.

13 **(c) (1) (I) SUBJECT TO SUBPARAGRAPH (II) OF THIS PARAGRAPH,**
14 **A COUNTY MAY ESTABLISH A TRAINING WAGE FOR EMPLOYEES WORKING IN THE**
15 **COUNTY.**

16 **(II) A TRAINING WAGE ESTABLISHED UNDER**
17 **SUBPARAGRAPH (I) OF THIS PARAGRAPH MAY NOT BE LESS THAN:**

18 **1. FOR AN EMPLOYEE SUBJECT TO THE FEDERAL**
19 **ACT, THE MINIMUM WAGE FOR THAT EMPLOYEE UNDER THE FEDERAL ACT; OR**

20 **2. FOR AN EMPLOYEE WHO IS NOT SUBJECT TO THE**
21 **FEDERAL ACT, THE HIGHEST MINIMUM WAGE UNDER THE FEDERAL ACT.**

22 **(2) AN EMPLOYER MAY PAY AN EMPLOYEE A TRAINING WAGE**
23 **ESTABLISHED UNDER PARAGRAPH (1)(I) OF THIS SUBSECTION FOR THE FIRST 2**
24 **YEARS OF EMPLOYMENT IF:**

25 **(I) THE COUNTY IN WHICH THE EMPLOYEE WORKS**
26 **ESTABLISHED THE TRAINING WAGE; AND**

27 **(II) THE EMPLOYEE HAS NOT BEEN EMPLOYED PREVIOUSLY**
28 **BY ANY EMPLOYER.**

29 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
30 October 1, 2014.
