## 2 Frederick County - Alcoholic Beverages - Organizational Licenses Act of 2014

- FOR the purpose of authorizing the Board of License Commissioners of Frederick 4 County to issue a certain alcoholic beverages license to certain organizations 5 6 located in the county; requiring the net proceeds of the sale of alcoholic 7 beverages under certain licenses to be used solely for certain purposes; altering a certain restriction on the number of bottles of wine that may remain open at 8 9 any one time at a wine sampling or tasting event in the County; prohibiting a 10 single individual at an event from consuming more than a certain amount of 11 wine from all brands in a single day; requiring the Board to adopt certain regulations; and generally relating to alcoholic beverages licenses in Frederick 12 13 County.
