- 15 (a) Subject to the requirements of this section, a jury judge or, if a county's
- 16 jury plan allows, its jury commissioner may disqualify, excuse, or exempt an
- individual who is summoned for jury service or reschedule jury service.

20 21	(3) When the period set under this subsection expires, a jury commissioner again shall summon the individual for jury service.
