A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

Nancy Grasmick Teacher Award and Walter Sondheim Jr. Public Service Internship Scholarship – Qualifications

4 FOR the purpose of requiring the Office of Student Financial Assistance to assist in $\mathbf{5}$ the repayment of certain higher education loans owed by certain recipients of a 6 Nancy Grasmick Teacher Award who receive certain degrees from certain 7 institutions of higher education in the State or outside the State; adding certain 8 individuals who attended certain institutions of higher education and also 9 graduated from certain high schools in the State to the list of individuals eligible for a certain repayment program; altering the name of the Walter 10 Sondheim Jr. Public Service Summer Internship Scholarship Program to be the 11 12Walter Sondheim Jr. Public Service Internship Scholarship Program; expanding 13 the scope of the Walter Sondheim Jr. Public Service Internship Scholarship Program to include fall and spring public service internships; specifying the 14dates that scholarship awards must be made for spring, summer, and fall 1516 internships; altering a certain definition to authorize a certain student 17attending an institution of higher education outside the State to qualify for a Walter Sondheim Jr. Public Service Internship Scholarship; altering certain 1819qualifications for eligibility for a Walter Sondheim Jr. Public Service Internship 20Scholarship; requiring the Governor to include in the State budget for certain 21fiscal years a certain appropriation for the Walter Sondheim Jr. Public Service 22Internship Scholarship Program; defining a certain term; and generally relating 23to the Nancy Grasmick Teacher Award and the Walter Sondheim Jr. Public 24Service Internship Scholarship Program.
